- i. CHS students competed in the Regional Science Bowl at Henry Ford College for the first time marking the beginning of a new challenge that our CHS students have embarked upon.
- ii. CHS Mock Trial team competed in the Oakland Regional Tournament. The team faced nearly 20 other schools from across Michigan in a highly competitive and challenging civil case.
- iii. CHS Quiz Bowl competed in the Southern Wayne Quiz Bowl League and earned a spot in the Class A State High School Quiz Bowl Tournament, which will be held on the campus of the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.
- iv. Crestwood High School's Key Club proudly represented our school at the 75th Annual Michigan District Service Leadership Conference. Our students earned 1st Place in Video, 1st Place in Interclub Relations, 2nd Place in Partners in Service, and 2nd Place in Single Service.
 - a. Junior Ali Beydoun earned the Outstanding Bulletin Editor Award.
 - b. Junior Elissa Hadla was recognized as the Lieutenant Governor of the Year.

- v. College Board School Recognition Award: 44 students have preliminarily qualified for the College Board School Recognition Award. This is an academic honor celebrating high school sophomores and juniors who achieve in the top 10% of their school on the PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10, or earn 3+ on two or more AP exams by 10th grade.
- vi. **2026 NHS Scholarship:**
 - a. Hadi Nassereddine was named a National Semi-Finalist for the 2026 NHS Scholarship, receiving \$3,200. He is one of 575 students in the Nation that received this honor.
 - b. Fatme Khalil was named a National Finalist for the 2026 NHS Scholarship, receiving at least \$5,625. She will travel to Washington DC with chapter advisor, Ms. Abbas. She was chosen among thousands of applicants across the country and multiple overseas NHS chapters as one of 25 National Honorees.
- vii. Dr. Mercedes Harvey-Flowers won the Secondary Educator Award from the Michigan Reading Association for the use of interdisciplinary reading strategies. She was honored as the State recipient at the Michigan Reading Association Conference.
