HALL OF CHAMPIONS ASSOCIATION HISTORY

When Norristown Area School District's (NASD) new Norristown Area High School (NAHS) opened in September 1973 replacing A.D. Eisenhower High School, Athletic Director Curtis Coull, 1948, and Human Relations Advisor Charles Blockson, 1952, discussed recognizing outstanding athletes who had graced the halls of the district's high schools.

NASD Superintendent of Schools Dr. Jay Gruener; NAHS Principal Les Eckman; Assistant Superintendent for Instruction Gene Hollick; School Board members Jim Wood, 1947; and Charles Biehl, 1935; NASD Teachers' Association President Nancy Collier, 1949; and local sports fan Louis Spinelli, 1928 met with them on January 18, 1977 to form a committee to "perpetuate the accomplishments of the outstanding athletes of the NASD."

The establishment of a Hall of Champions in the athletic wing to keep a permanent record of the NAHS student athletes who had achieved district, state, national, or international recognition was proposed at the meeting. The goal was to generate an awareness of the success the students had achieved and pride in their accomplishments by both the student body and the community. The community, including staff, students, and alumni, were asked to assist in identifying, researching, and compiling data on the athletic accomplishments worthy of recognition.

While agreeing that it was important to honor the accomplishments of former athletes, the committee also decided to recognize alumni's post-secondary accomplishments. A Hall of Fame would honor alumni who have distinguished themselves in their post-secondary lives.

In March the committee formally organized itself. Officers elected were Curtis Coull and Charles Blockson as co-chairmen of the NAHS Hall of Champions Committee, Nancy Collier as secretary, and Fred Lobb, 1948, as treasurer. A \$2,000 donation was requested from the NASD school board to fund remounting of pictures and trophies restoration. Additional funds were to be raised in the community by publicizing the newly formed organization and its goals.

The committee met monthly through the spring. Wilmer Cressman, 1949, became the Publicity and the Fundraising committees chairperson. Charlie Hood, 1946, researched the cost of making plaques for inductees. Coull and Blockson met with Dr. Ammon G. Kershner, 1908, to discuss athletes from his era, and Nancy Collier contacted area high schools and colleges regarding criteria they use for their Hall of Fame. Parke Ulrich, Esq., 1948, wrote the association's by-laws, and the name the Hall of Champions Association was adopted.

By-laws were adopted that fall, formalizing the structure of the new Hall of Champions Association, which was followed by establishing the criteria for acceptance into the two halls and designing a Hall of Champions Association membership application.

By early September, the Hall of Champions Association had 41 paid members. At the December meeting, the selection committee recommended ten nominees as the first Hall of Champions induction which was held on April 27, 1978. The first Hall of Fame induction was held on October 26, 1978. Two inductions a year continued until 1998 when one induction was held in November for both Halls. Currently, 210 alumni have been inducted into the Hall of Fame and 215 have been inducted into the Hall of Champions.

Special Awards

- Charles, Frank, Thomas, Joseph and James (Vince) Genuardi were honored in October 1987.
- The NAHS 1976 DECA team, director, teacher and advisors were recognized for their national championship in October 1989.
- Grace and Cecil Bean were presented with a Distinguished Service Award for Humanitarian Service to the Community in November 2013 for their work at St. John's Church Soup Kitchen for over 20 years.
- Frank G. (Hank Cisco) Ciaccio received a Humanitarian Award for Distinguished Service to the Community as Norristown's first Ambassador of Good Will in November 2014.

The Hall of Champions Association's contributions in support of NAHS

- 1981 – Placed in the school cafeteria the Paul M. Shellenberger, Sr. memorial showcase, long-time coach, teacher and the Hall of Champions Association founder.
- Placed a plaque in the NAHS athletic wing in memory of Arnold V Sharpley, a former Association director and a Hall of Champions inductee.
- Installed a baseball scoreboard in conjunction with NHS Class of 1941.
- Honor outstanding NAHS student athletes and scholars at each induction ceremony.
- Sponsors a financial award at the Senior Awards Ceremony to a senior who best represents the Hall of Champions Association's ideals of scholarship, sports and service.
- 2000 to 2011 – Presented the Louis A. Spinelli Memorial Award to a NAHS sports fan “who best typifies the interest and dedication to NAHS interscholastic athletics.” The honorees, in chronological order, were Ronald J. Bolton, 1948; Lee Schwartz; Eleanor F. Cresswell; Sam C. Barone, 1951; Carmelita C. Growcott, 1954; Frank X. McDevitt; Alfred Letrinko; Richard Schonely; Clarence Henning; James Nutridge, 1976; Frank and Marilyn Montgomery; and Donald L. Bowers, Sr.
- 2003 – Awarded \$2,500 scholarships to a graduating male and female student in honor of the Association's 25th Anniversary.
- 2004 – Awarded five \$1,000 scholarships to two NAHS senior boys, two NAHS senior girls and one Montgomery County Center for Technical Studies student.
- 2006 – Dedicated the Founders' Showcase in the cafeteria. The showcase was constructed by Brad Hurrell, Class of 2003.
- 2007 - Restored the silver 1923 undefeated football team's trophy which now resides in the athletic wing's trophy case.
- 2007 – Presented a plaque to NAHS in honor of the 100th anniversary of the school's alma mater *Blue and White* written by H. Severn Regar, Class of 1907-S.
- 2011 – Made a \$1000 donation to the Norristown Area Education Foundation for the new NAHS athletic field located on the NAHS campus.
- 2012 – Restored and relocated the Pete Lewis plaque from Roosevelt Field to NAHS.
- 2017 – Refurbished the Roosevelt Field bronze plaque marking the 1945 renovation and modernization of the stands and field including new locker room facilities.

High School Athletic Achievements

Played football all four years at NAHS, earning varsity letters in 1979, 1980, and 1981 as a starting offensive tackle on the team.

As a junior, he helped the team to a 7-3 record and was named to the All-Suburban One Second Team for his efforts.

Was selected as team captain his senior season and helped the team record improve to 8-3. Was named to the All-District One First team, the Pennsylvania All-State Third team as an offensive tackle.

Played in the 1982 Big 33 Game and the Montgomery County North/South Game.

Received the N-Club Award for Football his senior year.

Post High School Education

Graduated in 1987 from the University of Arizona with a Bachelor’s Degree in Public Administration.

Graduated from the Pennsylvania State Police Academy in 1989.

Post High School Athletic Achievements

Played offensive guard for the University of Arizona’s football team. Played in the 1985 Sun Bowl and the 1986 Aloha Bowl with the Wildcats.

Professional/Personal

Was a police officer in Springfield Township, Montgomery County for 34 years, retiring in 2023. Was the recipient of many commendations from township police chiefs, neighboring police departments and residents during his career.

Basketball - Inducted 2025

High School Athletic Achievements

Was a four-year start for the NAHS women’s varsity basketball team at guard and forward, earning four varsity letters.

Recognized by the Suburban One League all four years. Was an Honorable Mention as a freshman, was named to the Second Team as a sophomore, and was selected to the First Team All Suburban One in her junior and senior years.

Was named to the *Times Herald’s* All-Area Teams for four years. As a freshman was on the Honorable Mention team, as a sophomore was on the Second team, and was named to the First Team her junior and senior seasons.

Led the Lady Eagles to a 15-1 record in league play and to a Suburban One Championship her junior year. As a senior, she scored her 1,000th point as an Eagle on her way to scoring over 1,300 points in her high school career with an average of 15 points per game.

Her NAHS coach, Stanley Johnson, said, “Thea has been the heart and soul of this program for the last four years. She led by example in everything she does.... Reaching 1,000 points is a testament to her skill, but what made her special was her commitment to the team and her love for the game.”

Played basketball for the Del Val AAU Stars.

Professional/Personal

Worked as a mason after graduation from Central Montgomery County Vo-Tech School.

Is the daughter of 2007 Hall of Champions inductee Theodore A. Ellis, Class of 1951, and is the sister of 2017 Hall of Champions inductee Theron A. Ellis, Class of 1986.

Thea passed away on October 8, 2013. She had three sons, Terill A., Theo A, and Tonee (deceased).

Track and Field – Inducted 2025

High School Athletic Achievements

Played four-sports at NAHS. Played field hockey for three years; received two varsity letters; and was on the All-Suburban One team in 2001. Played basketball for two years, primarily on the JV team but saw some time on the varsity team.

Earned two varsity letters in indoor track and four in outdoor track and field, competing on the 100 m, 200 m and 400 m relay teams, in the 100 and 300 hurdles (H); and the 200 and 400 high jump. Named All-League (2000-02). In PIAA States, won a silver medal in the 300 H (2000, 2002); was a finalist and a bronze medalist in the 100 H (2001, 2002); placed 6th in 200 m (2001, 2002); and won a silver medal in the 200 H (2002). Was the 2000 USATF 400 H Olympic National Champion. In 2001 was named All-State in the 400 H; placed 8th in the 400 H in the World Youth Championships in Hungary; and was the 400 H Adidas Outdoor Nationals Champion.

At the 2000 Penn Relays finished first in the 4x100 and second in the 4x400. Was the 4x400 champion in the Suburban American Conference in 2000 and 2001. Set seven indoor and outdoor NAHS school records in the 60H, 200 relay, 300H, and 400H in 2001-02.

High School Activities

Was a member of NAFAD (Norristown Area Fight Against Drugs) and the African American Awareness Club. Elected class president in 2002 and was on the NAHS Honor Roll.

Post High School Education

Received her B.S. in Technology with a concentration in Graphic Communication Systems at North Carolina A&T State University (NCA&T) in 2006. Was on the dean's list and inducted into Alpha Lambda Delta Honor Society. Participated in PA Aggies, NCA&T Gospel Fellowship Choir (2003), Work Sector (2004-05) and Youth Taking Charge College Ministry (2006)

Post High School Athletic Achievements

Won the MEAC outdoor championship in the 400H and was NCA&T Rookie of the Year (2003).

Competed in the 2004 NCAA Division I Track & Field Championships in the 400H and was named NCA&T MVP. Named to the 2005-06 All-MEAC Indoor team in the 400m. In 2006 was the MEAC Outdoor champion in the 400H; competed in the NCAA Division I Track & Field Championships in the 400H and was named to the 400H All MEAC team.

Set five NCA&T indoor and outdoor time school records in the 200 m, the 400 m and the 400H.

Professional/Personal

Ran 400H in the USA Track & Field National Championships (2006, 2007); placed fourth at the 2007 Melrose Games in the 500 m dash; anchored the first-place national record-breaking USA 4x400 Team in Osaka, Japan; and won the 4x100 and 4x400 in the Penn Relay Olympic Development (2007, 2008).

Coached NAHS' track and field and basketball; and track and field at West Chester University, Howard Technical HS, and Elkton HS. Was on the Friends of Cecil County Parks and Rec Board (2017-21). Is a KB Foundation Board Member (2017-Present). Founder and coach of the Velocity Xpress Track Club (2017-present).

Is currently a Design Patent Examiner for the US Patent & Trademark Office.

Resides with her husband Jamaal and their children Jeremiah, Nava, and Raelyn in Charlotte, NC.

High School Athletic Achievements

Wrestled and played baseball all four years at NAHS and was the team captain in both sports.

In wrestling, won Section III titles in 2003, 2005, and 2006, and placed second in 2004. In District competition, placed second in 2003, fourth in 2004, sixth in 2005, and third in 2006.

Placed fourth in 2003 and first in 2006 in regional competition and qualified for the PIAA State championship.

With a career wrestling record of 140 wins, 31 losses and 15 falls, Jake was named to the All-Suburban One first team in 2003, 2004, and 2005.

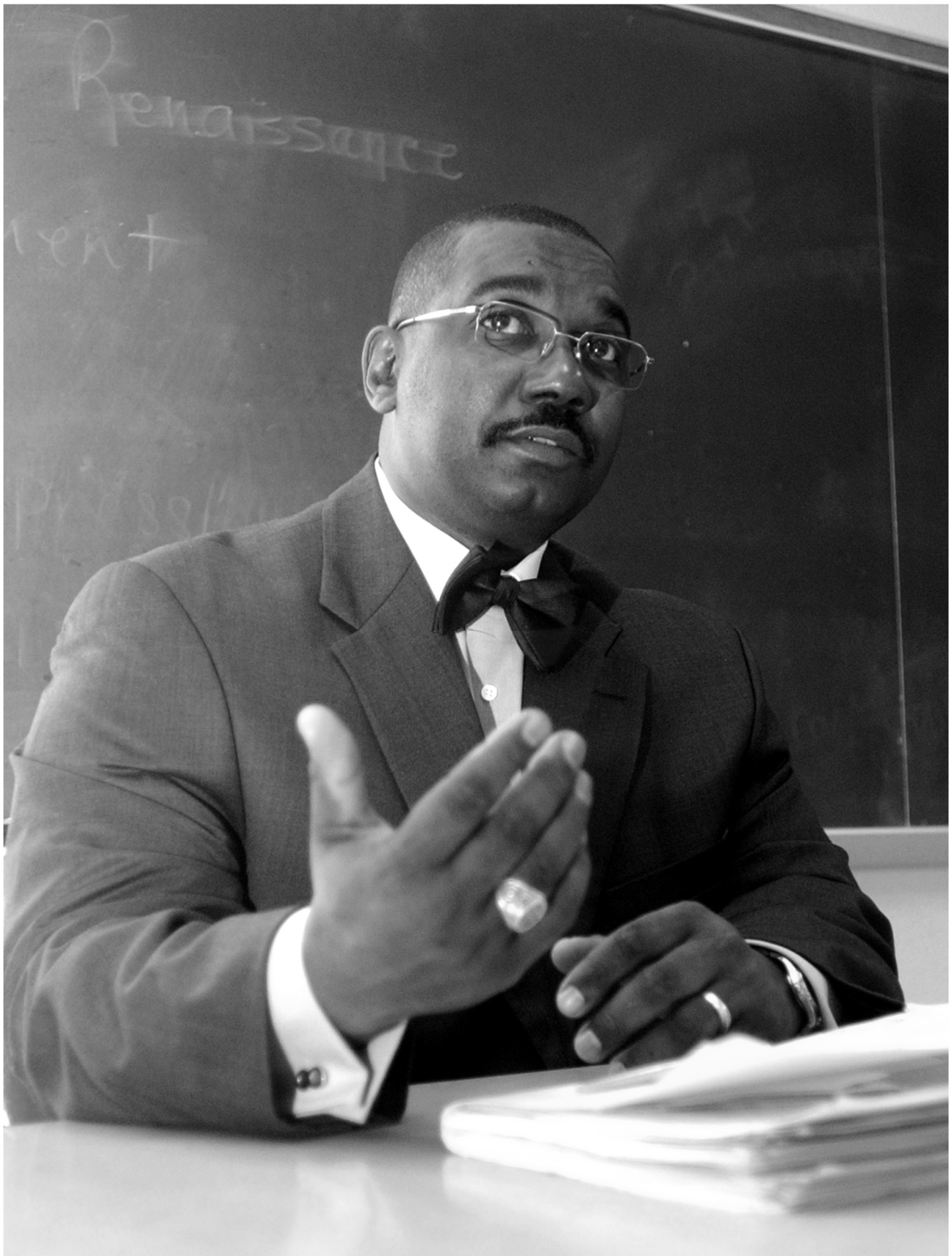

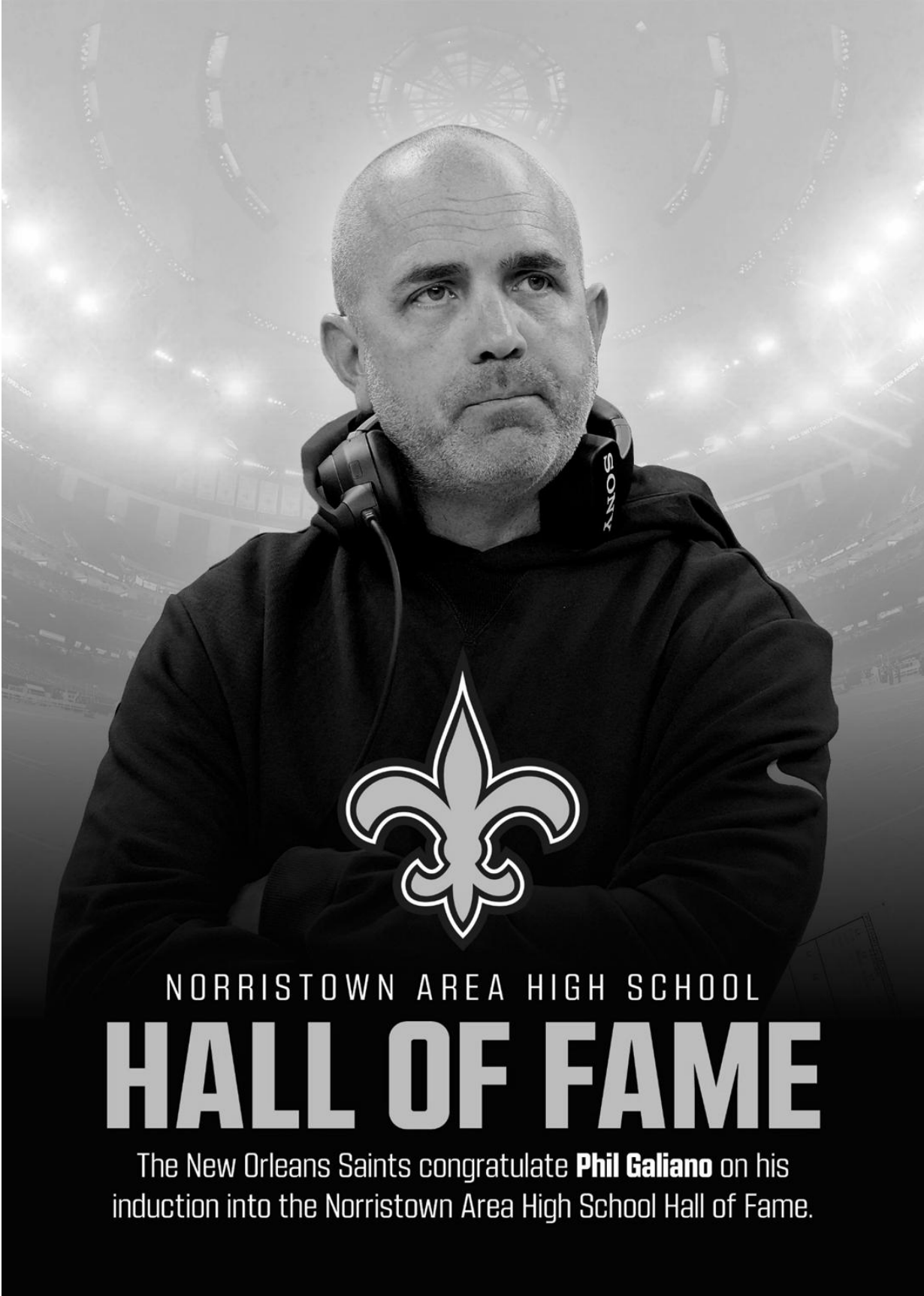

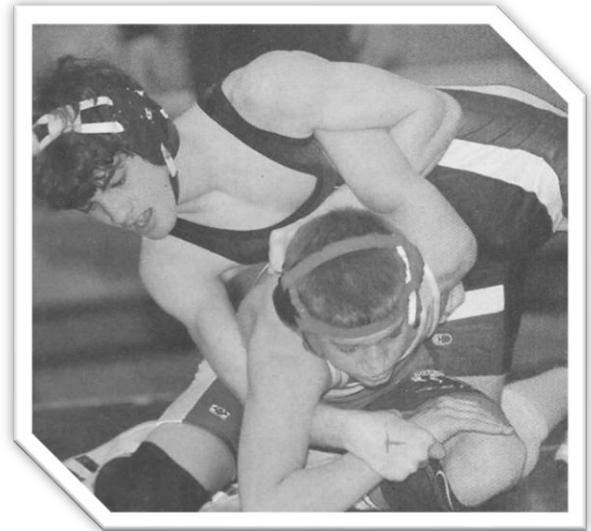
