Members of the Board of School Trustees of the Brownstown Central Community School Corporation met in Regular Session at the Brownstown Central Superintendent's Office at 7:30 p.m., on Tuesday, June 9, 2026.

An executive session was held at 5:30 p.m. prior to the regular meeting to receive information about prospective employees and discuss individuals over whom the governing body has jurisdiction. (I.C. 5-14-1.5-6.1) (b) (5) (6) and discuss discussion of strategy with respect to any of the following: Initiation of litigation or litigation that is either pending or has been threatened specifically in writing. (I.C. 5-14-1.5-6.1) (2) (B)

President Clayton Beard called the meeting to order. Tory Rudolph led the Pledge of Allegiance, and a moment of silence was observed.

Roll call was taken by President Clayton Beard. Members Jerry Hounshel, Greg Hutcheson, Levi Nehrt, Steve Ritter, Tory Rudolph, and Brian Wheeler were present, as were Superintendent Tim Taylor, Assistant Superintendent Jade Peters, Alisha Griffin, Marty Young, Will Hubbard, Corey Lanier, several patrons, and one member of the media.

On a motion by Brian Wheeler, seconded by Greg Hutcheson, the board unanimously approved the Minutes of the May 11, 2026 board meeting.

President Clayton Beard recognized Melissa Brown and Amanda Robertson who signed in to address the board.

Mr. Peters reported there was one Emergency Allocation to Southern Roofing for roof leak repairs at the high school and elementary school in the amount of \$2,871.00. Emergency Allocations beginning balance was \$89,817.41, this month's expenditures totaled \$2,871.00 leaving a balance of \$86,946.41. On a motion by Jerry Hounshel, seconded by Levi Nehrt, the board unanimously approved the Emergency Allocation.

Mr. Taylor asked for approval of the 2026-2027 Administrator Salaries and Benefits at Status Quo. On a motion by Brian Wheeler, seconded by Tory Rudolph, the board unanimously approved administrative salaries and benefits.

Mr. Taylor asked for approval of the renewal of the 2026-2027 Administrator Contracts at Status Quo. On a motion by Brian Wheeler, seconded by Levi Nehrt, the board unanimously approved the renewal of the administrative contracts.

Mr. Taylor asked for consideration of the resolution of adding preschool positions to the Public Employees Retirement Fund. On a motion by Brian Wheeler, seconded by Tory Rudolph, the board unanimously approved the resolution of adding preschool positions to PERF.

Mr. Taylor asked for approval of participation in the Indiana Association of Educational Service Centers Procurement Group for third party purchasing. On a motion by Greg Hutcheson, seconded by Levi Nehrt, the board unanimously approved the participation in IAESC Procurement Group for third party purchasing.

Mr. Taylor asked for approval of the Students/Athletic Handbooks for 2026-2027. On a motion by Tory Rudolph, seconded by Levi Nehrt, the board unanimously approved the students/athletic handbooks.

Mr. Taylor asked for approval of the Flexibility Waiver Resolution. Each year we have to apply to the Department of Education for a waiver that allows us to implement early dismissal days. We had previously approved this resolution, however the Department of Education requested we add some additional Indiana Code information to the resolution. On a motion by Greg Hutcheson, seconded by Tory Rudolph, the board unanimously approved the resolution.

Mr. Taylor asked for approval of the 2026-2027 Lunch Prices. High School will stay status quo \$3.15, Middle School \$3.15, Elementary School \$3.15. All other lunch and breakfast prices remained status quo. On a motion by Jerry Hounshel, seconded by Levi Nehrt, the board unanimously approved lunch prices.

Mr. Taylor gave the second reading and asked for approval of the BCCSC Cell Phone Policy. On a motion by Brian Wheeler, seconded by Greg Hutcheson, the board unanimously approved the cell phone policy.

Mr. Taylor gave the second reading and asked for approval of the BCCSC Transfer Sick Day Policy. On a motion by Tory Rudolph, seconded by Levi Nehrt, the board unanimously approved the transfer sick day policy.

Mr. Taylor recognized Jerry Hounshel for his service on the board representing Driftwood Township.

Mr. Taylor stated we are aware of a breach of contract lawsuit filed against the corporation. The events at issue arise from business email compromise affecting another entity's email system, not the corporation's email system. We will vigorously defend the suit and do not expect to provide additional comment while the litigation is ongoing.

Mr. Taylor congratulated the Archery Teams on all three schools for qualifying for the World Tournament at Daytona Beach on June 18th. Sixty-three students will be competing. He wished the Archery Teams good luck, and thanked all of the community members and businesses supporting the teams' trips through financial support.

Mr. Taylor congratulated the BCHS Baseball Team and BCHS Softball Team on their Sectional Championships.

Mr. Taylor congratulated the BCHS Boys Golf Team on winning the first Sectional Championship in school history.

Mr. Taylor congratulated the following Spring athletes on being recognized as MSC All-Conference Athletes; Hailey Bair –Softball, Jaylee Yeadon –Softball, Drake Goodpaster –Baseball, Jaxson Johnson –Baseball, Genna Preston –Tennis. Honorable Mention Athletes; Josie Ault Beavers –Softball, Lyla Huffman –Softball, Lucas Ira –Baseball, Lane Pendleton –Baseball, and Eulah Beavers –Tennis.

Mr. Taylor congratulated Jaxson Johnson on being selected to the South All-Star Baseball Team.

Mr. Taylor congratulated the BCHS Class of 2026. Thirty-three percent of the class earned the Indiana College Core, Forty percent earned an Academic Honors Diploma, Fifty-seven percent are attending college or trade school, two percent are enlisting in the armed forces, and sixty-seven percent earned college credits.

Mr. Taylor shared the Summer Meal Program is giving out meals twice a week this summer to school-age children. We gave out 1,944 meals on the first distribution day.

Mr. Steve Ritter congratulated the Archery Teams and Baseball Team.

Mr. Jerry Hounshel congratulated the Baseball Team and the Archery Teams, and stated things are going good at Brownstown Central. He thanked the board and stated it has been an honor serving on the board representing Driftwood Township.

Mr. Greg Hutcheson congratulated BCHS Graduates, Spring Sport Athletes, and wished Archery Good Luck at Worlds. He thanked Jerry for his service to the school board and stated he learned a lot from Jerry when he first joined the board.

Dr. Levi Nehrt thanked Jerry for his service to the board.

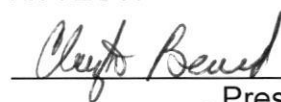
