Plainfield Community Consolidated School District No. 202 is receiving bids for the **WASTE DISPOSAL SERVICES** at all locations. Mandatory Bids are due Friday, May 7, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. at which time they will be publicly opened and read aloud. A mandatory pre-bid meeting for the purpose of obtaining pertinent information in regards to the WASTE DISPOSAL SERVICES is strongly recommended. The mandatory pre-bid meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 28, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. at the District Operations Facility at 14812 S. Eastern Avenue, Plainfield, Illinois 60544. The bid opening will take place in the offices of the Plainfield Community Consolidated School District 202 Richard Eldred Operations Facility, at 14812 S. Eastern Avenue, Plainfield, Illinois, 60544, at the time stated above.

The Plainfield Community Consolidated School District 202 (PSD) intends to award the services to the contractor providing the lowest combined price for services to all PSD buildings. PSD reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids or any portion thereof for failure to comply with the bidding requirement and to waive any non-material defects as permitted by law, as PSD deems in the best interests of PSD.

Disposal services are to be rendered to PSD buildings for a period of three (3) years commencing July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2024, with PSD having two (2) additional one (1) year options.

It is the intent of this invitation for bid to stabilize the cost of disposal services for the period effective July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2024.

The Board of Education reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to accept bids in whole or in part and/or to waive any irregularities or defects in the proposal, when, in its opinion, such action will serve the best interests of the Board of Education of School District No. 202.

INSTRUCTIONS AND CONDITIONS

INSTRUCTIONS AND CONDITIONS

1. Bid Submittal. Bidders must provide three (3) complete sets of all bid documents at time of submission of bid documents. Each bid must be wholly completed in the form prescribed in the bid documents and must be submitted in a sealed envelope which shall be marked WASTE DISPOSAL SERVICES and include the name and address of the bidder. Sealed bids must be delivered by hand or mail and received up until 9:00 a.m. on May 7, 2021 by and at the following address: District Operations Facility, 14812 S. Eastern Avenue, Plainfield, Illinois, 60544, Attn: Paul Gonzalez, Director of Facilities.
2. Pre-Bid Meeting. All bidders are to attend a mandatory pre-bid meeting, which will be held on April 28, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. at the District Operations Facility, 14812 S. Eastern Avenue, Plainfield, Illinois. If any changes to these bid documents and specifications result from the pre bid meeting, the changes will be delivered to the prospective bidders in advance of the bid deadline. Failure to attend this meeting may affect availability and access to the areas within the scope of work.
3. Late Bids. Unsigned bids or bids received after 9:00 a.m. on May 7, 2021 will not be accepted. The method of transmittal of the bid proposal is at the bidder's risk of untimely receipt by School District 202.
4. Bid Guarantee. Each bid must be accompanied by a Bid Guarantee in the form of a bid bond, certified check or bank draft in an amount equal to not less than ten percent (10%) of the bid and made payable to the Board of Education of Plainfield Community Consolidated School District No. 202, Will and Kendall Counties, Illinois. Checks or drafts of unsuccessful bidders will be returned as soon as practical after opening and checking the bids. If the successful bidder refuses to enter into a contract with School District 202, the amount of the Bid Bond will be forfeited to School District 202 as liquidated damages and not as a penalty.
5. General Guaranty. The contractor agrees to:
 - a. Save the District, its agents and employees harmless from liability of any nature or kind for the use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted composition, secret process, patented or unpatented, invention, article or appliance furnished or used in the performance of the contract which the contractor is not the patentee, assignee, licensee or owner.
 - b. Protect the District against latent defective material or workmanship and to repair or replace any damages or marring occasioned in transport or delivery.
 - c. Pay for all permits, licenses and fees and file all notices and comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of the local government.
6. Delivery: All bid prices should include delivery of freight charges to specified facilities. The work for WASTE DISPOSAL SERVICES shall be coordinated with the Director of Facilities, Paul Gonzalez, (815) 439-5452 once the bid has been awarded.
7. Responsibility for Equipment/Materials Shipped. The contractor shall be responsible for the equipment or supplies covered by this contract until they are delivered at the designated point, but the contractor shall bear all risk on rejected equipment and supplies after notice of

rejection. Rejected equipment or supplies must be removed by and at the expense of the contractor promptly after notification of rejection.

Upon failure to do so within ten (10) days after date of notification, the District may return the rejected equipment or supplies to the contractor at his risk and expense, or dispose of them as its own property.

7. Inspections. Inspection and acceptance of supplies and materials will be made after delivery. Final inspection shall be conclusive except as regards to latent defects, fraud, or such gross mistakes as amount to fraud. Final inspection and acceptance or rejection of the materials or supplies will be made as promptly as practicable, but failure to inspect or accept or reject materials or supplies shall not impose liability on the District for such materials or supplies as are not in accordance with the specifications. All delivered materials shall be accepted subject to inspection and physical count.
8. Inclusive of all Costs. Prices quoted shall be all inclusive of all costs including transportation, prep, etc., F.O.B. destination.
9. Taxes. School District 202 is exempt from Illinois State sales and use taxes and Federal Excise tax, therefore, bids should not include sales or excise tax.
10. Withdrawal. A bidder may withdraw or change a bid if written notice of the withdrawal or change is received by School District 202 before the latest time specified for submission of bids. Any change may be made only by substitution of another bid. The successful bidder may not withdraw, cancel, or modify their proposal after the bid has been opened.
12. Award of Contract. School District 202 reserves the right to reject any and all bids or portions of bids, and to waive informalities or irregularities in any bid, and to award the contract in the best interest of School District 202. The contract will be awarded, if at all, to the lowest responsible bidder meeting specifications as determined by School District 202. While the financial responsibility of the bidder is a significant concern, School District 202 is equally concerned with the proven ability of the bidder to satisfactorily perform his contract so that the service will be provided in accordance with proposed contract documents.
13. Bids. The signing of the Bid Submittal Form shall be construed as acceptance of all provisions contained herein. All bids shall be submitted with each space properly completed. Any explanation or statement which the bidder wishes to make must be placed in the same envelope with the bid. Unless the bidder so indicates, it is understood that the bidder has bid in strict accordance with the specification requirements. Bidder acknowledges that any deviation from the specifications will be grounds for School District 202 to reject the bid, although School District 202 may accept the bid with the deviation if, in its sole discretion, it determines that such bidder's bid is in School District 202's best interest. All bids shall be deemed final, conclusive, and irrevocable. No claim for relief because of errors or omissions in the bidding will be considered, and bidders will be held strictly to the bids as submitted. When an error is made in extending total prices the unit bid price will govern. Carelessness in quoting prices, or in preparation of bid otherwise, will not relieve bidder. Erasures or changes in bids must be initialed. Should a bidder find any discrepancies in, or omissions from any of the documents, or be in doubt as to their meanings, the bidder shall submit questions in writing to Mr. Paul Gonzalez, Director of Facilities, who will issue any necessary clarifications to all prospective bidders by means of addenda. Bidders must satisfy themselves upon examination of these specifications, as to the

intent of the specifications. The School District shall not accept any further questions after 3:30 p.m. on April 30, 2021. After the submission of the proposal, no complaint or claim that there was any misunderstanding in regard to items listed for bidding will be entertained from either party.

14. Addenda. Addenda in connection with the bidding of this work/supplies/equipment may be issued by School District 202 by public posting at the Plainfield School District Richard Eldred Operations Facility, 14812 S. Eastern Ave. Plainfield, IL 60544 and by transmission by regular mail and/or facsimile to those interested bidders who have requested notice of addenda in writing addressed to:

It is the responsibility of the bidder to determine whether addenda have been issued by the School District. Lack of knowledge of addenda will not be grounds for a bidder to withdraw a bid after the bid opening or to fail to enter into the contract after the award of the bid.

15. Qualified Bidders. Bidders must have a minimum of five years performing similar waste disposal work with at least 15 contracts of similar scope of work. Bidder to supply list of those references.
16. Financial Stability. School District 202 may require, upon request, evidence as to the financial stability of the bidder. Upon request, the bidder shall provide the following information to School District 202 within 48 hours:
 - A. The name of any owner or co-owner, equity of each co-owner or corporate offices of the entity submitting the bid, and the name, address, and business telephone number of each such person.
 - B. The last financial statement and balance sheet of the bidder, including a specification in detail of all loans outstanding, or a copy of the last certified annual audit.
17. Bid to Remain Open. No bids shall be withdrawn for a period of 90 calendar days after the date of the bid opening without the consent of School District 202.
18. Investigation of Bidders. School District 202 will make such investigations as are necessary to determine the ability of the bidder to fulfill bid requirements. The bidder shall furnish such information as may be required which will assist School District 202 in making such determination.
19. Compliance with Laws. The successful bidder shall at all times observe and comply with all laws, ordinances, regulations and codes of the federal, state, county and other local government agencies, which may in any manner affect the performance of the contract and in particular any such laws pertaining to safety. All District School buildings and grounds are smoke free zones by law 89-181. In addition, the successful bidder shall comply with all School District 202 policies. It shall be mandatory that the successful bidder will not discriminate against members of the public, any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, physical or mental impairment unrelated to ability,

or unfavorable discharge from military service; and further that the successful bidder will comply with all the provisions of the Illinois Human Rights Commission as required by the rules and regulations for public contracts.

20. Prevailing Wage. It shall be mandatory upon the successful bidder and upon any subcontractor thereof to pay all laborers, workmen, and mechanics employed by them not less than the general prevailing rate of wages as found by School District 202 or the Department of Labor for each craft or type of worker or mechanic needed to execute the contract and the general prevailing rate for legal holiday and overtime work as ascertained by the Illinois Department of Labor. The prevailing wage rates are revised by the Department of Labor periodically and are available on its website. The Contractor shall comply with all provisions of the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/0.01 *et seq.*, applicable to the Work. Payment of any contractor shall not be processed without receipt of certified employee records required by 820 ILCS 130/5.
21. USDOL Apprenticeship. Bidding Contractor must be affiliated with a USDOL approved apprenticeship training program for trades that will be used on this contract. Contractor shall include documentation with their bid:
 - A. Laborers
 - B. Operators
22. Criminal Background Check. The successful bidder shall authorize School District 202 to execute fingerprint/criminal background investigations of any employee or successful bidder regularly assigned to perform work at School District 202 and shall provide School District 202 with a list of the names and addresses of each employee who may be so assigned. Costs related to criminal background investigation of the successful bidder's employees are the responsibility of the successful bidder.
23. Sexual Harassment Certificate. Each bid must be accompanied by a Certificate Regarding Sexual Harassment Policy certifying that the bidder has a written sexual harassment policy as required by section 2-105 of the Illinois Human Rights Act (775 ILCS 5/2-105). The form of the Certificate Regarding Sexual Harassment Policy is included within the bid documents. No bid shall be considered responsive unless accompanied by a Certificate Regarding Sexual Harassment Policy.
24. Bid-Rigging Certificate. Bidders must certify that they are not barred from bidding on this project as a result of a conviction for either bid-rigging or bid rotating under Article 33E of the Criminal Code of 1961. The provided certification form must be signed by a duly authorized agent of the bidding company and returned with your proposal. Failure to do so shall disqualify your bid.
25. Drug-Free Workplace Certificate. Each bid from a company with 25 or more employees must be accompanied by a Certificate of Compliance with the Illinois Drug-Free Workplace Act certifying that the bidder shall provide a drug-free workplace for employees engaged in the performance of work under the contract and that the bidder is not barred from bidding on public contracts due to a violation of the Illinois Drug-Free Workplace Act (30 ILCS 1 *et seq.*). Each bid from an individual must be accompanied by the Certificate of Compliance with the Illinois Drug-Free Workplace Act certifying that the successful bidder shall not engage in the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance in the performance of the contract and that the successful bidder is not barred from bidding on public contracts due to a violation of the Illinois Drug-Free Workplace Act. The forms of the Certificate of Compliance with the Illinois Drug-Free Workplace Act are included within the bid documents.

No bid shall be considered responsive unless accompanied by a signed certificate where applicable. The contract award shall be subject to suspension of payments or termination, or both, if it is determined that the bidder has made false certification or that the bidder has violated the certification by failing to carry out the requirements of the Illinois Drug-Free Workplace Act.

26. Drug and Alcohol Testing. Each bid must be accompanied by a copy of the successful bidder's current drug and alcohol testing procedures, which must be in strict compliance with State and Federal regulations.
27. No Assignment. The contract shall not be assigned, nor shall any part of the same be subcontracted, without the written consent of School District 202, and in no case shall such consent relieve the successful bidder from its obligations, or change the terms of the contract.
28. Independent Contractor. The successful bidder shall not be held or deemed in any way to be an agent, employee, or official of the District, but rather an independent contractor furnishing services for the District.
29. Removal of Employees. School District 202 reserves the right to request that the successful bidder remove any employee for unsatisfactory performance, appearance, behavior, or attitude.
30. Termination. School District 202 reserves the right to terminate successful bidder upon ten days written notice if in the judgment of School District 202 the successful bidder has breached any provision of the contract or failed to perform to the satisfaction of School District 202.
31. Insurance. During the term of this Agreement, the Contractor, at its sole cost and expense, and for the benefit of the School District, shall carry and maintain the following insurance:
 - A. Comprehensive general liability and property damage insurance, insuring against all liability of Contractor related to this Agreement, with a minimum combined single limit of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) general aggregate;
 - B. Professional Liability Insurance with limits in the per claim amount of not less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) and the annual aggregate of not less than Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000).
 - C. Automobile liability Insurance with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000;
 - D. Worker's Compensation: Statutory

Employer's Liability: \$1,000,000 each accident-injury; \$1,000,000 each employee-disease; \$1,000,000 disease-policy.

Such insurance shall evidence that coverage applies to the State of Illinois and provide a waiver of subrogation in favor of School District 202; and
 - E. Umbrella liability insurance with a minimum combined single limit of One Million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) general aggregate.

The insurance shall include sexual abuse and molestation coverage. All insurers shall be licensed by the State of Illinois and rated A+-VII or better by A.M. Best or comparable rating service. The comprehensive general liability and property damage insurance policy shall name School District 202, its Board, Board members, employees, agents, and successors as an additional insured on a primary noncontributory basis with a waiver of subrogation in favor of School District 202. The successful bidder shall provide School District 202 with certificates of insurance and/or copies of policies reasonably acceptable to School District 202 evidencing the existence of the coverage described above, including form and deductibles, during the duration of the contract. The failure to provide acceptable insurance shall be deemed a breach of the contract entitling School District 202 to terminate the contract immediately. All policies of insurance shall provide by endorsement that no coverage may be canceled, terminated, or reduced by the insuring company without the insuring company having first given at least 30 days prior written notice to School District 202 by certified mail, return receipt requested. The successful bidder must furnish to School District 202 all required insurance, and other documents, all within seven days after signing a Contract with the Owner.

Contractor shall have full power and authority to select the means, manner, and method of performing his/her services and School District 202 shall have no right to exercise and shall not exercise any control or supervision over the means, manner, or method of performance of the Contractor's work. Contractor is responsible for all injuries to persons or property caused by Contractor's operations and shall indemnify and hold harmless School District 202 for any liability, loss, expenses, claims, legal fees, judgments, damages it incurs as a result of Contractor's operations. School District 202 reserves the right to immediately suspend or terminate Contractor's performance of the work should School District 202 determine that Contractor's operations on School District 202 premises are being conducted in a manner that poses an imminent danger to persons or property.

Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify, protect and save harmless School District 202 from and against any and all losses, damages, costs, claims, lawsuits, whether groundless or not, judgments, settlements and expenses including without limitation attorney's fees and court costs, arising or alleged to have arisen due to actions of the Contractor or any breach of this contract.

32. Indemnification. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the successful bidder shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless School District 202, the Board of Education, its members, employees, agents, officers, officials and successors from and against any and all liabilities, taxes, tax penalties, interest, losses, penalties, damages and expenses of every kind, nature and character, including costs and attorney fees, arising out of, or relating to, any and all claims, liens, damages to person (including death) or property, obligations, actions, suits, judgments, settlements, or causes of action of every kind, nature and character, in connection with or arising out of the contract and bid documents and any acts or omissions of the successful bidder or its employees or agents. The indemnities set forth herein shall survive the expiration or termination of the contract.
33. Performance Bond. The successful bidder shall furnish a Performance Bond in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract Sum. The bond surety must carry a BEST RATING of A. Such bond shall be in a form and with a surety acceptable to School District 202 and shall not include a limitation period shorter than provided by Illinois law. The Performance Bond shall guarantee the performance of the duties placed on the successful bidder under this Contract and its compliance with any applicable laws, and shall indemnify School District 202 and its Board members, officers, employees, and agents (the "Indemnitees"), from any liability or loss

to the Indemnitees from any failure of the successful bidder to fully perform each or all of said duties.

Bidders must not have had claims or actions against a bond in the past five (5) years.

34. Permits. The successful bidder shall pay for all permits, licenses and fees and file all notices and comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of the local government.
35. Damage to Property. In the event School District 202 's property or any of the surrounding areas are destroyed or damaged as a result of the successful bidder's work under the contract, the successful bidder shall, at successful bidder's sole cost, restore the property or any surrounding area. Such restoration shall be to a condition at least equivalent to the condition of the affected area immediately before the destruction or damage. In addition the successful bidder shall protect School District 202 against latent defective material or workmanship and repair or replace any damages or marring occasioned in transport or delivery.
36. Subletting Contract. It is mutually understood and agreed that the Contractor shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet, or otherwise dispose of its contract or its right, title or interest therein, or its power to execute such contract, to any other person, firm or corporation, without the previous written consent of the District, but in no case shall such consent relieve the Contractor from its obligation, or change the terms of the Contract.
37. Subcontractors. Within 48 hours after the Bid opening, the apparent low bidder shall submit a complete list of Subcontractors and the amount of their bid. The competence and responsibility of all Subcontractors shall be considered in awarding the Contract. If Subcontractors are unknown to School District 202 or if their competence is questioned, it is understood that such Subcontractors shall file with School District 202, upon request, evidence of facilities, equipment, experience, financial and other data and references for investigation and qualification of said Subcontractors. School District 202 reserves the right to reject any Subcontractor who fails to meet aforementioned requirements, and to reject the bid of a bidder for failure to provide competent Subcontractors. After the award of the contract, the aforementioned list of subcontractors shall be modified as discussed and directed by School District 202, and shall be resubmitted.
38. Governing Law. The contract shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois without regard to conflict of law principles. Jurisdiction and venue for all disputes hereunder shall be the Circuit Court located in Cook County, Illinois, or the federal district court for the Northern District of Illinois.
39. Bidder's Agreement. The bidder hereby declares understanding, agreement and certification of compliance to provide the WASTE DISPOSAL SERVICES to School District 202, at the prices quoted, in accordance with all terms and conditions, requirements, and specifications of the original Bid Specifications, and any issued amendments. The bidder further agrees that the language of this document shall govern in the event of a conflict with (1) his/her bid or (2) any subsequent purchase order between the bidder and School District 202. The bidder should, as a matter of clarity and assurance, also sign and submit all amendment(s) issued by School District 202 with this bid. A written award (or Acceptance of Bid) mailed (or otherwise furnished) to the successful Bidder with the time for acceptance specified in the Invitation to Bid shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party.

Explanations WILL COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER

The grouting, cleaning, and polishing of all classes of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cement tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass, mosaics, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walls, ceilings, swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATIONS TECHNICIAN

Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair and service of radio, television, recording, voice, sound and vision production and reproduction, telephone and telephone interconnect, facsimile, equipment and appliances used for domestic, commercial, educational and entertainment purposes, pulling of wire through conduit but not the installation of conduit.

MARBLE FINISHER

Loading and unloading trucks, distribution of all materials (all stone, sand, etc.), stocking of floors with material, performing all rigging for heavy work, the handling of all material that may be needed for the installation of such materials, building of scaffolding, polishing if needed, patching, waxing of material if damaged, pointing up, caulking, grouting and cleaning of marble, holding water on diamond or Carborundum blade or saw for setters cutting, use of tub saw or any other saw needed for preparation of material, drilling of holes for wires that anchor material set by setters, mixing up of molding plaster for installation of material, mixing up thin set for the installation of material, mixing up of sand to cement for the installation of material and such other work as may be required in helping a Marble Setter in the handling of all material in the erection or installation of interior marble, slate, travertine, art marble, serpentine, alberene stone, blue stone, granite and other stones (meaning as to stone any foreign or domestic materials as are specified and used in building interiors and exteriors and customarily known as stone in the trade), carrara, sanionyx, vitrolite and similar opaque glass and the laying of all marble tile, terrazzo tile, slate tile and precast tile, steps, risers treads, base, or any other materials that may be used as substitutes for any of the aforementioned materials and which are used on interior and exterior which are installed in a similar manner.

MATERIAL TESTER I: Hand coring and drilling for testing of materials; field inspection of uncured concrete and asphalt.

MATERIAL TESTER II: Field inspection of welds, structural steel, fireproofing, masonry, soil, facade, reinforcing steel, formwork, cured concrete, and concrete and asphalt batch plants; adjusting proportions of bituminous mixtures.

TRAFFIC SAFETY - Effective November 30, 2018, the description of the traffic safety worker trade in this County is as follows:

Work associated with barricades, horses and drums used to reduce lane usage on highway work, the installation and removal of temporary, non-temporary or permanent lane, pavement or roadway markings, and the installation and removal of temporary road signs.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Two or three Axle Trucks. A-frame Truck when used for transportation purposes; Air Compressors and Welding Machines, including those pulled by cars, pick-up trucks and tractors; Ambulances; Batch Gate Lockers; Batch Hopperman; Car and Truck Washers; Carry-alls; Fork Lifts and Hoisters; Helpers; Mechanics Helpers and Greasers; Oil Distributors 2-man operation; Pavement Breakers; Pole Trailer, up to 40 feet; Power Mower Tractors; Self-propelled Chip Spreader; Skipman; Slurry Trucks, 2-man operation; Slurry Truck Conveyor Operation, 2 or 3 man; Teamsters; Unskilled Dumpman; and Truck Drivers hauling warning lights, barricades, and portable toilets on the job site.

Class 2. Four axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors under 7 yards; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnapulls or Turnatrailers when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment under 16 cubic yards; Mixer Trucks under 7 yards; Ready-mix Plant Hopper Operator, and Winch Trucks, 2 Axles.

Class 3. Five axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors 7 yards and over; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnatrailers or turnapulls when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment over 16 cubic yards; Explosives and/or Fission Material Trucks; Mixer Trucks 7 yards or over; Mobile Cranes while in transit; Oil Distributors, 1-man operation; Pole Trailer, over 40 feet; Pole and Expandable Trailers hauling material over 50 feet long; Slurry trucks, 1-man operation; Winch trucks, 3 axles or more; Mechanic--Truck Welder and Truck Painter.

Class 4. Six axle trucks; Dual-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with hoist and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of sand, cement, marble chips, and all other materials that may be used by the Mosaic Terrazzo Mechanic, and the mixing, grinding, grouting, cleaning and sealing of all Marble, Mosaic, and Terrazzo work, floors, base, stairs, and wainscoting by hand or machine, and in addition, assisting and aiding Marble, Masonic, and Terrazzo Mechanics.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

MATERIAL TESTER & MATERIAL TESTER/INSPECTOR I AND II

Notwithstanding the difference in the classification title, the classification entitled "Material Tester I" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector I". Likewise, the classification entitled "Material Tester II" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector II".

Explanations KENDALL COUNTY

Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain. **CERAMIC TILE FINISHER**

The grouting, cleaning, and polishing of all classes of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cement tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass, mosaics, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walls, ceilings, swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATIONS TECHNICIAN

Construction, installation, maintenance and removal of telecommunication facilities (voice, sound, data and video), telephone, security, and data inside wire, interconnect, terminal equipment, central offices, PABX and equipment, micro waves, V-SAT, bypass, CATV, WAN (wide area network), LAN (local area networks), and ISDN (integrated system digital network), pulling of wire in raceways, but not the installation of raceways.

MARBLE FINISHER

Loading and unloading trucks, distribution of all materials (all stone, sand, etc.), stocking of floors with material, performing all rigging for heavy work, the handling of all material that may be needed for the installation of such materials, building of scaffolding, polishing if needed, patching, waxing of material if damaged, pointing up, caulking, grouting and cleaning of marble, holding water on diamond or Carborundum blade or saw for setters cutting, use of tub saw or any other saw needed for preparation of material, drilling of holes for wires that anchor material set by setters, mixing up of molding plaster for installation of material, mixing up thin set for the installation of material, mixing up of sand to cement for the installation of material and such other work as may be required in helping a Marble Setter in the handling of all material in the erection or installation of interior marble, slate, travertine, art marble, serpentine, alberene stone, blue stone, granite and other stones (meaning as to stone any foreign or domestic materials as are specified and used in building interiors and exteriors and customarily known as stone in the trade), carrara, sanionyx, vitrolite and similar opaque glass and the laying of all marble tile, terrazzo tile, slate tile and precast tile, steps, risers treads, base, or any other materials that may be used as substitutes for any of the aforementioned materials and which are used on interior and exterior which are installed in a similar manner.

Four axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors under 7 yards; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnapulls or Turnatrailers when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment under 16 cubic yards; Mixer Trucks under 7 yards; Ready-mix Plant Hopper Operator, and Winch Trucks, 2 Axles.

Class 3. Five axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors 7 yards and over; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnatrailers or turnapulls when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment over 16 cubic yards; Explosives and/or Fission Material Trucks; Mixer Trucks 7 yards or over; Mobile Cranes while in transit; Oil Distributors, 1-man operation; Pole Trailer, over 40 feet; Pole and Expandable Trailers hauling material over 50 feet long; Slurry trucks, 1-man operation; Winch trucks, 3 axles or more; Mechanic--Truck Welder and Truck Painter.

Class 4. Six axle trucks; Dual-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with hoist and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of sand, cement, marble chips, and all other materials that may be used by the Mosaic Terrazzo Mechanic, and the mixing, grinding, grouting, cleaning and sealing of all Marble, Mosaic, and Terrazzo work, floors, base, stairs, and wainscoting by hand or machine, and in addition, assisting and aiding Marble, Masonic, and Terrazzo Mechanics.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

MATERIAL TESTER & MATERIAL TESTER/INSPECTOR I AND II

Notwithstanding the difference in the classification title, the classification entitled "Material Tester I" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector I". Likewise, the classification entitled "Material Tester II" involves the same

job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector II".

SPECIFICATIONS

WASTE DISPOSAL SERVICES BID SPECIFICATIONS

1. Purpose: The purpose of this specification is to describe the requirements for removal and disposal of solid waste and recyclable materials within the Plainfield Community Consolidated School District #202 (PSD).
2. Scope: The Contractor shall provide containers based on Attachment A1 – Facility and Container Location Information and provide all services set forth in the Contract Documents for each location:

Any request to modify the quantity and/or size of containers at any location must be submitted in writing to PSD at least 10 days prior to the date set for bid opening. Requested modifications that are not approved in writing by PSD prior to bid opening will not be considered and any bids containing unapproved modifications will be rejected.

3. Collection and Materials. The contractor shall provide all necessary labor, materials, containers and equipment for the collection, removal and proper disposal of all trash and recyclable within PSD. All services shall be in such a manner as to be in compliance with all applicable federal, state, county and municipal requirements and regulations. Special collections are to be scheduled for days when the regularly scheduled collection falls on a holiday, or when the collection is delayed due to weather or equipment failure.
4. Contract Period. The contract period shall be as follows:
 - a. Year 1 July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022
 - b. Year 2 July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023
 - c. Year 3 July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024
5. Contract Extension. This contract is to be for a period of three consecutive school years. PSD wishes to have the option to renew this contract on an annual basis for two additional years following completion of the third year of the contract. In this regard, if PSD exercises its option for the period of July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025, then the annual contract amount for that term will be the annual contract amount for the July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024 contract term, increased by the lesser of (a) three percent (3%) or (b) the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers for the preceding calendar year. If PSD exercises its option for the period of July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026, then the annual contract amount for that period will be the amount for the prior year, increased by the lesser of three percent (3%) or (b) or (b) the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers for the preceding calendar year. Unit prices, if accepted, will be subject to the same increases for any renewal period. It is understood that renewals will be at the option of PSD pursuant to the above parameters, subject to the approval of all parties. PSD will provide the contractor with forty-five days written notice of intent to renew.
6. Collection Times. The contractor shall schedule collections and removals to avoid conflict with PSD activities. Removal times shall be consistent with local municipality requirements and in no case shall be before 6:00AM.
7. Collection Schedule. See Attachment A1

8. Compliance with Laws and Regulations. The contractor's services and actions shall comply with all applicable federal, state, county and municipal laws, regulations and other requirements.
9. Taxes. No charge will be allowed for federal, state or municipal sales or excise taxes for which PSD is exempt by law. Exemption certificates, if required, will be furnished on forms provided by the contractor.
10. Contractor Techniques. The contractor will be permitted to use techniques generally acceptable for the removal of trash and garbage and the recycling of materials.
11. Containers. The contractor shall supply all containers referenced in these General Conditions and Specifications free of charge. Containers may be front end, side or rear loading containers. All containers shall be placed in designated removal areas for each location. All containers shall be scrubbed clean, repaired, repainted and sanitized at periodic intervals, no less than once per contract year. All containers shall have operable covers in good working order. All doors and hardware shall be in good working order. Containers shall be constructed of high quality steel with one-piece fronts, bottoms and backs for added strength to prevent leakage. Side section seams are to be continuously welded. All points of stress are to be welded with extra heavy bead.

PSD reserves the right to relocate the removal area at no additional cost to PSD. PSD will notify the contractor in writing two weeks prior to the effective date of the relocation. The contractor shall relocate his containers prior to the effective date. Should PSD install "dumpster enclosures" (at PSD's cost), the contractor will be required to properly open and re-secure the enclosure gates or doors during collections.

12. Additional Refuse. The contractor shall remove, at no additional charge, any additional refuse, in plastic bags, placed next to the containers at the time of collection. Debris in the removal area, caused by the collection or transfer shall be picked up and the area broom cleaned by the contractor prior to the contractor leaving the area.
13. Additional Pickups. From time to time, the amount of trash or waste generated may necessitate additional pickups by the contractor. PSD will call the contractor to request additional pickups on a per school location basis. Additional pickups will be based on the contractor's unit prices set forth in the bid, unless such prices are rejected by PSD. PSD shall retain the right to contract with a third party for such services if it deems that it is in PSD's best interests to do so.
14. Failure to perform. PSD reserves the right to deduct from the contractor's invoice, charges for each failure to pick up trash, garbage and recyclables as specified, as well as failure to keep the removal areas clean of debris. Deductions shall be based on the contractor's unit prices.

The failure of the contractor to perform for three consecutive business days will result in PSD considering that the contractor has abandoned the contract. In the event this situation occurs, the contract will be terminated and any monies due the contractor will be applied towards the additional costs borne by PSD to have the wastes removed from the

schools. Additionally, the contractor will be responsible for any additional cost to PSD of having the contracted services performed for the remainder of the contract term.

15. Equipment: All trucks (compactor or others) used by the contractor to pick up trash, garbage or recyclables shall be watertight to prevent spillage of liquid at the removal areas. Trucks used by the contractor shall be in good condition; in the event of vehicle breakdown(s), the contractor will be responsible to provide replacement vehicles to remove the wastes.

The contractor shall be responsible for any damage done to PSD property resulting from the services provided under this contract. All PSD property is designated as "Non-Smoking". All traffic signs, regulations and speed limits shall be strictly observed. Contractor personnel shall show extreme caution when students or staff is in the area. Contractor vehicles may not be left, unoccupied, without the prior removal of the ignition keys.

16. Invoicing Procedures. The contractor shall submit written invoices by the 25th of each month showing services provided to the end of the month. Extra pickups or other services will be shown on separate line items. PSD will normally process the invoice with other monthly bills, which are submitted to the PSD Board of School Directors for approval at their regularly scheduled meetings. Payments will be mailed within five (5) business days after Board approval.

17. Material Disposal. The solid waste generated by PSD shall be disposed of in accordance with all applicable land disposal and federal, state and local requirements including, but not limited to, the requirements of the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, and local municipalities, as applicable. The contractor shall arrange for proper disposal of the solid waste at landfill facilities or other appropriate facilities. The contractor will advise PSD of the disposal location.

18. Recycling. The contractor shall be responsible for the collection, transportation, and proper disposal off premises of the recyclable materials in such locations and in such a manner as to be in compliance with all applicable state, county, and municipal requirements and regulations. Recyclable material shall be collected in a single stream recycling program and include flattened cardboard; newspaper; office paper; co-mingled glass; aluminum and tin cans; and plastic bottles deposited in the same container.

The contractor will provide at no additional charge one container at each location as outlined in Attachment A1.

The contractor will provide at no additional charge one or more containers at each location as outlined in Attachment A1 that will be designated as a recyclable container.

Quarterly and at no additional cost, the contractor will provide PSD with documentation reflecting the weight of recycled materials.

19. Yard Vegetation Waste. If requested, the contractor shall provide a container for the collection, transportation, and proper disposal off premises of Yard Vegetation Waste in such locations and in such a manner as to be in compliance with all applicable state,

county, and municipal requirements and regulations. Yard vegetation waste shall mean grass clippings, weeds, garden plants, shrubs, branches, limbs and brush emanating from each facility. The size, location and frequency of collection will be determined by the District at a later date.

20. Roll-off Containers. From time to time, PSD may have need for roll-off containers. These roll-off containers will be filled with wastes or trash generated by PSD. The contractor will provide unit prices for the roll-off containers comprised of a haul cost and a weight per ton costs. PSD reserves the right to use either this contract for roll-off containers or others.
