ISBE Announced Presidential Scholar Nominees

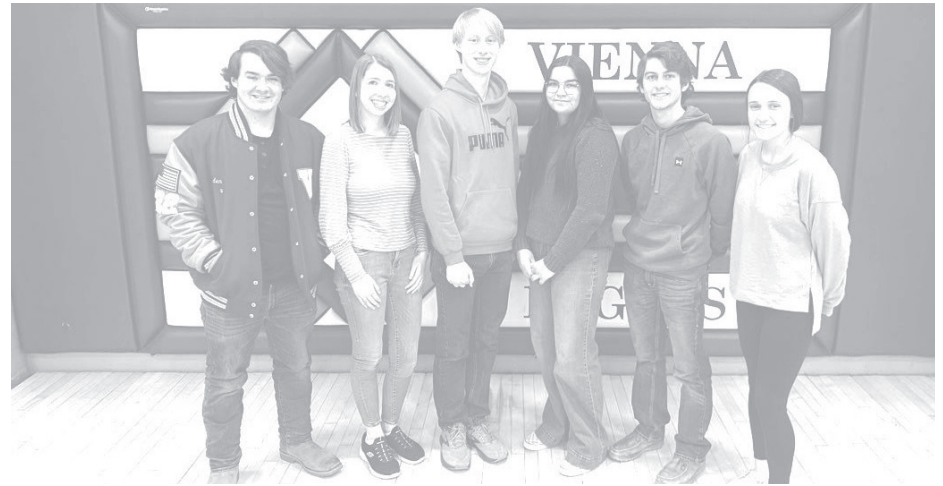
