The public will be invited back into Council Chambers when the Councils return from executive session.

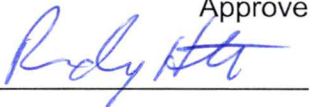
Discussion and possible action on the following item(s)

1. Discussion and Action regarding the Town of Parker Wastewater System, Water System Backflow, and Building Moratorium. The Town Council may vote to discuss this matter in Executive Session pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03 (A)(3) and (4). Additionally, the Town Council may vote to negotiate with the Tribal Council regarding these matters in Executive Session as permitted pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03 (A)(6).

Mayor Hartless thanks Chairwoman Flores for the invitation to meet with the tribes regarding the joint venture sewer system. The group discusses the potential issues regarding the water system and the current status. Headstart permitting and the hookup to the system are discussed. Chairwoman Flores expressed the need to work together, especially for the sake of the opening of the new headstart. Project length is discussed for the building of a new plant. Chairwoman Flores notes that they have spoken to the Governor and BIA regarding the status of the plant. Possible engineering services are discussed, and ways to save money on those costs are discussed. Mayor Hartless notes the status of our current lease and possible grant applications. Current flow and how to split the costs are discussed. Tribal EPO is discussed, and it was noted that the plant has been inspected multiple times. Additional data regarding the flow and usage is again discussed, and the Tribal Council notes that they would like to see additional data regarding that. Future leases are discussed, and additional permitting issues are addressed.
