Board of Commissioners Meeting

April 16, 2026

5:00 P.M. at City Hall

The City of Forest Hills, Tennessee, Board of Commissioners met at 5:00 p.m. on April 16 at City Hall. Mayor Lanson Hyde presided over the meeting. Vice Mayor Henry Trost and Commissioner Jim Gardner were also present. City Staff present included City Manager Mark Hill, City Engineer Luke Sullivan from the firm Neel-Schaffer, City Attorney Marshall Albritton and City Recorder Charlotte Hunter.

1. Approval of Minutes. After review and consideration, and upon motion made by Vice Mayor Trost, duly seconded by Commissioner Gardner, the Board unanimously approved the minutes of the March 2026 meeting of the Board of Commissioners.
2. Approval of Financial Statements. After review and consideration, and upon motion made by Commissioner Gardner, duly seconded by Vice Mayor Trost, the Board unanimously approved the financial statements for February 2026.

3. New Business

a) Metro Police Dept - Monthly Briefing

Amanda Kozen presented the numbers for the past month with 54 total calls with only 5 traffic stops, 10 for extra patrol, 2 fires, 9 alarm calls, 4 911 hang ups, 5 crashes, and 2 loose cows (TWRA was called). We had one theft of construction material on Old Hickory Blvd.

b) Ordinance 2026-02 FY 2025-2026 Budget Revision & FY 2026-2027 Budget

After review and consideration, and upon motion made by Commissioner Gardner, duly seconded by Vice Mayor Trost, the Board approved the Ordinance for the Budget.

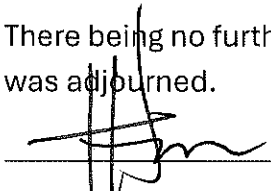
4. Reports from Staff

- a. Mark Hill/City Manager. Hill stated the grant for tree planting has occurred and all 87 trees have been planted along Hillsboro Pike. Next month we will have a Planning Commission meeting, and it will be time to renew IDIQ, paving and street preservation bids. Storm Update: Debris pick up will end on April 19th. The City has spent over \$1.2 but this figure doesn't include Crowder. The Flags will go up for Memorial Day through Labor Day next week or so.
- b. Luke Sullivan, P.E./City Engineer. Mr. Sullivan updated the Board on the 4 sites Jarrett is presently working and final paving is coming soon. Tyne Blvd ROW and the archaeological and historical preservation is with TDOT. We should be getting feedback very soon. Neel Schaffer has an archaeologist in Biloxi, MS that could come and help. We are still working on paving options for Kingsbury.
- c. Marshall Albritton, City Attorney, advised there are no pending lawsuits or claims with the City. However, 1242 Jefferson Davis could become an issue. 1229 & 1231 Vintage PL have been issued a stop work order because they clear cut over an acre and we need their Stormwater Management Plan.

5. Citizen's Comments.

David Young of 5169 Granny White Pike asked for extra help with debris removal as he lives at the end of shared driveway on Granny White Pike with no roadside space.

There being no further business to come before the Board of Commissioners, the meeting was adjourned.
