Mayor Bickers called the meeting to order at 6:02 PM.

Mayor Bickers led the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Mayor's Report and Approval of Monthly Financial Report:

Mayor Bickers communicated that ticket sales surpassed 2000 and expected to approach 3000 for the Wolfstock Music Festival set for 2021 August 06 & 07. So far, ticket buyers represent 12 states and Canada. Two of the originally scheduled performers have cancelled due to other commitments. A late rush is expected for tickets as the event approaches.

Mayor Bickers announced he plans to nominate Charles Perry for the open BZA position. The nomination will be made at the August BMA meeting.

Mayor Bickers announced that he is considering the creation of a Utility Board for the TOL. This board would address any utility issues or needs for the TOL including water, electric, sewer, natural gas or other potential utilities.

Mayor Bickers announced the creation of a committee to develop master plans and architectural details for significant new amenities for Town Hall property. Source of the funding will be the

American Rescue Plan (ARP) funds appropriated by the federal government. Mayor Bickers appointed Steven Kelley, Ron Kudich, Tom Swicegood, Linda Webb and John Huffman to the committee.

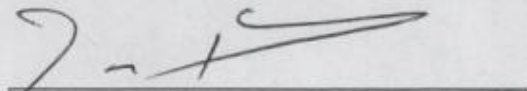

Resolutions and Ordinances: None

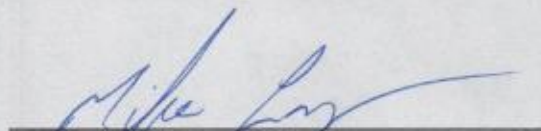
Other Action Items:

1. **Tractor Bid for Maintenance:** Mayor Bickers reviewed the three bids for a replacement tractor for TOL road maintenance. Mayor Bickers reviewed the need for this replacement as well as the poor condition of the current vehicle. Barry Loope, Road Supervisor, has reviewed the bids and recommended CMI Equipment Sales, Inc. be given the order as the low bidders. All BMA members were in agreement with placing the order with the low bidder. CMI will deliver this John Deere tractor to the Town Hall ready to use. The old tractor will be sold in a public auction.
2. **Road Paving Report:** Town Engineer Swicegood reported that the contract with Harrison has been signed for the 2021 Road Improvements. Harrison has tentatively scheduled the paving to begin the week of August 09, 2021.
