David Reece called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Approval of Minutes:

MOTION to approve the minutes from March 24, 2026 by Painter. Second by Headrick.
VOTE: UNANIMOUS. MOTION PASSES.

Public comments on agenda items (5 minute limit)

Anna Gibson expressed concern that information about the meeting and the Louisville Village Concept Plan was difficult to find online and requested more meeting content and agendas be posted publicly. She also commented on the proposed green space within the development, stating a preference for:

- Nature trails and preservation of natural wetlands rather than a large stormwater pond.
- Alternative water features for children, such as interactive fountains, instead of a splash pad.
- Consideration of small community attractions, such as a “tiny doors” trail concept similar to one used in Atlanta.
- Prioritizing Park restroom facilities and maintenance funding before adding new recreational amenities.

Jennifer Alldredge stated concerns regarding the proposed public linear park area beneath power transmission lines. The resident noted:

- Potential restrictions associated with TVA or utility-owned easements.
- Safety concerns related to recreational structures located near transmission lines.
- Concerns about stormwater runoff entering nearby coves and waterways.
- Preference for restoring wetlands and creating educational nature areas rather than additional commercial development.

Allie Suydam expressed concerns regarding:

- Limited public notice regarding the Louisville Village Concept Plan.
- Difficulty locating meeting agendas on the Town website. A desire for greater transparency and public access to information.

Chairman Reese and Mayor Pugh clarified that the concept plan presented by the developer was preliminary and not yet under formal consideration by the Town.

Old Business:

Disc golf update

- Reviewing property boundaries to ensure work remains within Town property.
- Contractors are expected to continue clearing and maintenance activities as scheduled.

RiverLine update

- Friendsville is interested in partnering with Louisville.
- Waiting on RiverLine for a decision regarding participating communities within the next 6-8 weeks.
- The program's goal of selecting approximately six Tennessee communities for participation during the 26-27 calendar year.

Mayor's Report

- Mayor Pugh reported that we're not going to purchase a batting cage. The Town will continue its policy of allowing organizations to reserve facilities without entering into exclusive-use agreements.
- I9 Sports plans to host three Saturday clinics during the summer.
- The BMW event went really well. A \$400 donation was made to the Town.

New Business:

Great Smoky Mountains Regional Greenway Council Meeting

- Efforts to connect local greenway systems with regional trail networks for pedestrians and bicycles including connecting Townsend to the rest of Blount County Greenways.
- Opportunities for future bicycle and pedestrian connectivity.
- Parking challenges associated with existing trail access points in Louisville at Smith & Wesson have been communicated to Blount County Parks and Rec and the Chamber of Commerce.

Louisville Village Concept Plan

- Mixed use plan.

Public comments on non-agenda items (5 minute limit)

A question was raised regarding the new development on Topside Road. This will be a farm store that includes produce, a coffee shop and an ice cream shop.

MOTION by Headrick to adjourn the meeting. Second by Lewis. VOTE: UNANIMOUS. Meeting adjourned at 6:28 p.m.
