PUBLIC COMMENT AND PARTICIPATION GUIDELINES: All participants shall comply with established rules of decorum; inappropriate or offensive comments are not permitted, and individuals who violate these rules may be ruled out of order or removed from the meeting if necessary. Members of the public may address the Mayor and Council on non-agenda matters after being recognized by the Chair. Upon recognition, speakers must approach the podium and state their name and address for the record. Each speaker is allotted up to five minutes and must limit comments to one topic. Public comment time is for statements only, not questions and answers, and comments from the audience without recognition will not be acknowledged. The Chair may limit total comment time if information becomes repetitive. At the Chair’s discretion, public comment may be allowed on agenda items, limited to the subject under discussion, with each person permitted to speak once for up to five minutes. Public comment will not be taken on Mayoral appointments, informational presentations, licenses, or bid and bill consideration.
