Accessibility Icons

 	Speak	Text to Speech (TTS). You can use Speak to listen to text in questions, answer choices, pop-ups, and rollovers being read aloud. Note: some tests have the ear icon.
	Microphone	Speech-to-text. Use the Microphone to activate speech-to-text. Use this in text boxes or anywhere you input text.
	Pop-up	Pop-up. You can click on a word or phrase that has a border around it and helpful information will Pop-up .
	Rollover	Rollover. You can use Rollover to see a different version of the sentences in the test questions.
	American Sign Lanugauge Video	You can use American Sign Language Video to play a signed video of the text in questions and answer choices.
	Settings	To adjust audio volume during the test, select in the upper-right corner. Students testing with TTS can also use this tool to adjust TTS settings.
