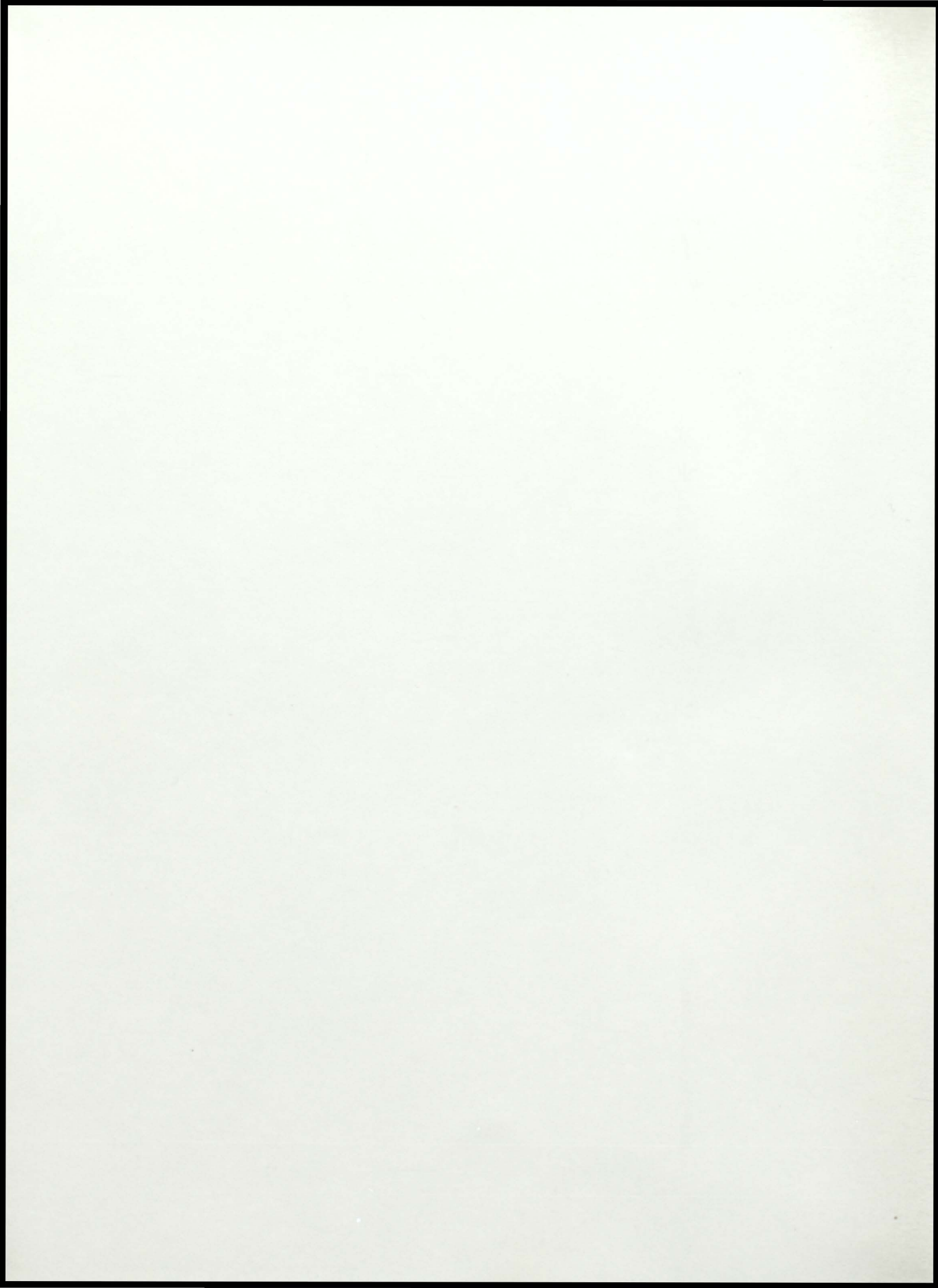

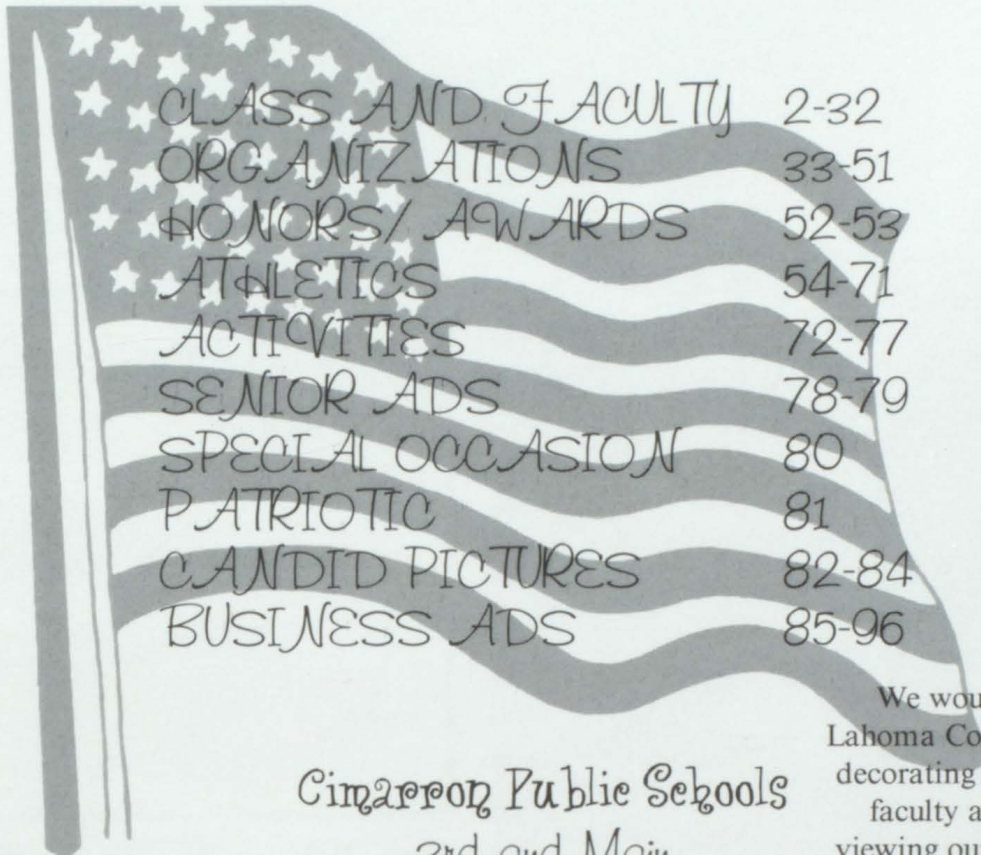


Many of the Cimarron students showed their patriotic spirit throughout the 2001/2002 year by wearing flags on their shirts.

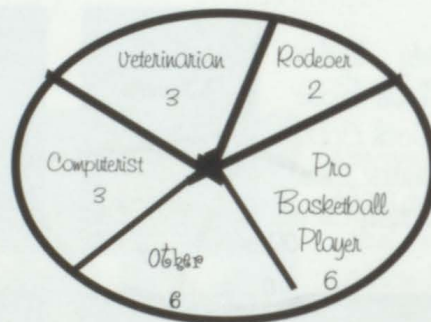
The fifth grade life isn't always fun and games, sometimes the students do have to study a little.

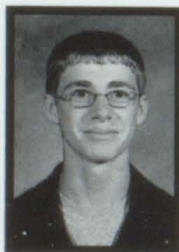
There are times the eighth grade students have to do a little homework.

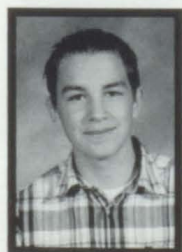

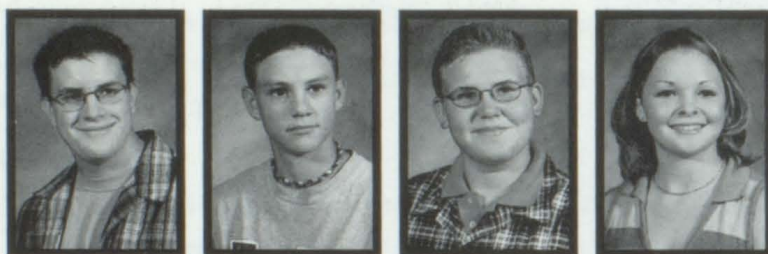

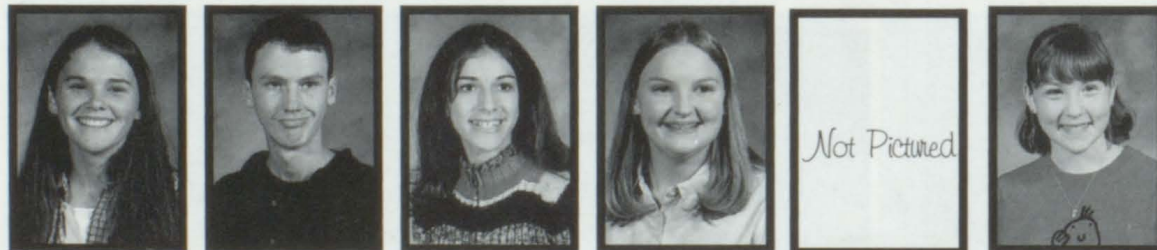

Lacey Jantz said, "When I hang out with friends, we get in trouble a lot--like in class. We also make fun of the guys in class."

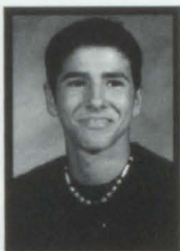
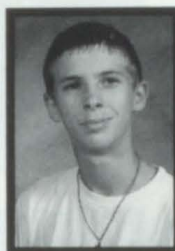
