The Council of Ashville convened in Regular Session from 6:30 PM to 7:03 PM in the Council Meeting Room at 200 East Station Street, Ashville, Ohio 43103. Mayor Embrey called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Colton Henson moved, seconded by Steve Welsh, to approve the October 16, 2023 minutes for the Regular Session as presented. All votes were yay.

MAYOR: Mayor Embrey thanked everyone who attended Mayor Wise's dedication ceremony and encouraged council to decide who they want on the NCA board.

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

POLICE: Chief George reported that Trick-or-Treat went well.

SEWER: Adam Kehoe reported that the security cameras at the WWTP had been installed and are active.

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR: Franklin Christman reminded everyone that the Public Hearing for the NCA will be held Monday, November 20 at 6:00 PM. Christman reported that a preconstruction meeting with Filmore Construction on November 8 for the Griggs Street paving project and that Rail Street at The Distillery is open. Roger Clark expressed concerns about safety and the village's culpability when opening a street while it's still under construction. Chief George said a NO THRU TRAFFIC sign has been posted. Clark said he would prefer the street be closed until construction is completed.

Roger Clark moved, seconded by Matt Scholl, to have the First Reading. All votes were yay. After the reading, Roger Clark moved, seconded by David Rainey, to accept the First Reading. 2023-11 AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE TEMPORARY APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE NEXT YEAR'S EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE, STATE OF OHIO, BASED UPON THE CERTIFICATE OF ESTIMATED RESOURCES ISSUED BY THE PICKAWAY COUNTY BUDGET COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2024, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. 2023-12 AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE PRELIMINARY PARTICIPATORY LEGISLATION BASED UPON RC 5521.01 FOR PROJECT PID NO. 117460 COUNTY/ROUTE/SECTION PIC-ASHVILLE-PED IMPROVE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Steve Welsh moved, seconded by Matt Scholl, to have the First Reading. All votes were yay. Colton Henson asked who determines where the Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons go. The VA

said that was determined a few years ago by the Safety Committee and the village's engineer. After discussion, Roger Clark moved, seconded by Matt Scholl, to accept the First Reading, suspend the Rules of Council, waive the Second and Third Readings, and adopt as an emergency measure. All votes were yay.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

- Steve Welsh reported that when preparing maps for a leak detection company, it was found that the WWTP was unnecessarily using approximately 32 GPM of drinking water to rinse the bar screens. It was determined that final effluent water could be used instead of drinking water to rinse the bar screens which will save the village approximately 40K gallons of drinking water per day.
- Roger Clark encouraged the PD to crack down on enforcement of the speed limit.
- Colton Henson expressed his condolences for the passing of Ula Jean Metzler and note what a great woman she was and will be missed.
- Mayor Embrey suggested the Safety Committee meet to discuss speed limit changes and add stop signs in the village.

GUEST COMMENTS:

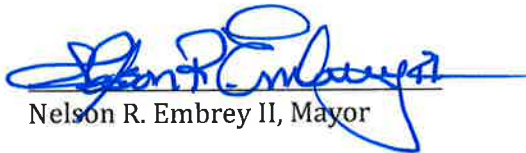
