

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

ASHVILLE COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION

Held: APRIL 15, 2024

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The Council of Ashville convened in Regular Session from 6:30 PM to 6:59 PM in the Council Meeting Room at 200 East Station Street, Ashville, Ohio 43103. Mayor Welsh called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Colton Henson moved, seconded by Matt Scholl, to approve the April 1, 2024 minutes for the Regular Session as presented. All votes were yay.

GUEST: Nancy Valette of the Viking Festival requested the chain that prevents vehicles from parking inside the park be temporarily taken down to allow the fesival vendors to set up for the event. Council approved the request. Valette also asked for the stingers to be attached to the fire hydrants by Wednesday.

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

FISCAL OFFICER:

- Matt Scholl moved, seconded by Colton Henson, to approve a Then & Now payable to Isaac Wiles & Burkholder in the amount of \$3794 for legal fees. All votes were yay.
- Dave Rainey moved, seconded by Randy Loveless, to approve a Then & Now payable to Harber Concrete Construction, LLC for sidewalk installation at 6 Plum Street in the amount of \$6450. All votes were yay.

POLICE: Chief George reported that two other officers will be leaving the department.

PLANNING & ZONING: Roger Clark moved, seconded by Colton Henson, to approve the Planning & Zoning Administrator's monthly report. All votes were yay.

SERVICE/STREET: Greg Sturgill presented plans for a pole barn that he would like to build at the Street Department for the storage of equipment. Chad Noggle asked if the height will be enough for future equipment. Bert Cline said it would be. Colton Henson moved, seconded by Matt Scholl, to have legislation drafted for the construction of the pole barn. All votes were yay. Sturgill then reported that he has a dump drump that is unsafe to operate and could be good for parts and requested permission to sell the truck. Dave Rainey moved, seconded by Randy Loveless, to approve the sale of the dump truck. All votes were yay. Sturgill closed by stating that he had been contacted by the ball league who asked that the village keep the Viking Festival from jousting on the main ball diamond. Dave Rainey said he was against preventing the fesival from using the ball diamond. Chad Noggle said he would like to look at another place for the jousting next year because it takes a lot of work, and isn't as simple as just

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dragging the diamond, to get it back in shape after the festival.

WATER: Jim Welsh reported that the new well should be operational Thursday.

COMMITTEES

PARKS: Roger Clark reported that the Parks Committee met prior the council meeting and discussed putting lighted Christmas trees in the park during the Christmas season. Clark said the Westside Park is currently on hold and that the committee wants to see if Impact Fees can be used to update the current park.

LEGISLATION

ORDINANCES FOR FIRST READING

2024-08 AN ORDINANCE IN THE AMENDING OF ORDINANCE 2012-05 AND APPROVAL OF THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR THE ROSS-PICKAWAY-HIGHLAND-FAYETTE JOINT SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Roger Clark moved, seconded by Dave Rainey, to table the reading until they could get more information about the plan. All votes were yay.

2024-09 AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE POSITION OF CONSTRUCTION REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Colton Henson moved, seconded by Dave Rainey to have the First Reading. After the reading, Dave Rainey moved, seconded by Randy Loveless, to approve the First Reading, suspend the Rules of Council, waive the Second and Third Readings, and adopt as an emergency measure. All votes were yay.

MAYOR

Mayor Welsh reported that he met with South Bloomfield reps and discussed partnering to purchase the Reed Farm property and making a joint park. Welsh said he met with Local Waste and that supervisors were going to ride along to monitor how trash pick up is being handled in the village. Welsh closed by saying that he had been made aware that members of CEDA had been meeting and noting inviting the village to attend. Welsh said he's going to find out why.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Matt Scholl asked if The Distillery has made all their developer payments. The Fiscal Officer said they have.

At 6:59 PM, Colton Henson moved, seconded by Matt Scholl, to adjourn the meeting. All votes were yay and the meeting adjourned.
