

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

ASHVILLE COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION

Held: JUNE 2, 2025

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The Council of Ashville convened in Regular Session from 6:30 PM to 6:57 PM in the Charles K. Wise Council Chambers at 200 East Station Street, Ashville, Ohio 43103. Mayor Welsh called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and requested a moment of silence.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Colton Henson moved, seconded by Randy Loveless, to approve the minutes for the May 19, 2025 Regular Session as presented. All votes were yay.

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR: Bert Cline reported that he would like to use the Impact Fees as a negotiating tool to encourage developers to join the NCA. Cline also said that he plans to put sidewalks from the laundromat on Long Street around the corner to the park. Cline stated that he denied the grant request for DHL. Roger Clark asked if the streets will be ready by the 4th of July. Cline said they will be. Cline reported that a pre-construction meeting for the Randolph Street project is scheduled for June 12th.

TAX ADMINISTRATOR: Roger Clark moved, seconded by Colton Henson, to approve the Tax Administrator's monthly report. All votes were yay.

MAYOR

Mayor Welsh reported that Fillmore Construction will be paving some of the roads throughout the Village and that Shannon Roese is patching some spots as well. Welsh said that the application window for resumes for the police chief position has closed and that a committee consisting of Charlie Morrison, Matt Scholl, and Sheriff Matt Hafey will start interviews soon. Mayor Welsh also said that he'd received a complaint about a pothole at Powell and Cherry Streets. The VA will have the Street Department look at it.

LEGISLATION

RESOLUTION FOR THIRD READING

05-2025 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE TO BEGIN TAKING THE STEPS NECESSARY TO CREATE A REGIONAL WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT WITH THE VILLAGE OF SOUTH BLOOMFIELD, PICKAWAY COUNTY, AND HARRISON TOWNSHIP, AUTHORIZING UP TO \$20,000 TO ACCOMPLISH SAME, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Roger Clark moved, seconded by Colton Henson, to have the Third Reading. All votes were yay. After the reading, Roger Clark moved, seconded by Chad Noggle, to accept the Third Reading and adopt. All votes were yay with the exception of Colton Henson who

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abstained.

2025-06 AN ORDINANCE CREATING, ESTABLISHING, AND ADOPTING THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT STAFFING MATRIX AND PAY SCHEDULE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Randy Loveless moved, seconded by Roger Clark, to have the Third Reading. All votes were yay. After the reading, Roger Clark moved, seconded by Chad Noggle, to accept the Third Reading and adopt. All votes were yay.

NEW BUSINESS: Roger Clark moved, seconded by Colton Henson, to approve the use of Government Impact Fees to complete administrative building updates in the amount of \$3190

COMMITTEE COMMENTS

PARKS: Roger Clark reported that he and Samantha Pemberton have been looking at park equipment and working to get quotes.

UTILITIES: Chad Noggle reported that the Utilities Committee met and discussed water meter options for the apartments at 161 West Main Street and that the Village Administrator will be sending out a letter to the property owners listing those options. Colton Henson asked for an update on the new WTP. The VA said that he recently met with the engineer and that the design phase was nearly completed.

COUNCIL COMMENTS:

Dave Rainey asked Lt. Cline how the hiring process was going at the PD. Cline said they are struggling to get good candidates.

Chad Noggle requested a Utilities Committee meeting for Wednesday, May 21st at 4:00 PM.

At 6:57 PM, Colton Henson moved, seconded by Randy Loveless, to adjourn the meeting. All votes were yay and the meeting adjourned.
