Held: JUNE 17, 2024

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The Council of Ashville convened in Regular Session from 6:30 PM to 6:46 PM in the Council Meeting Room at 200 East Station Street, Ashville, Ohio 43103. RESOLUTIONS FOR THIRD READING

06-2024 A RESOLUTION AMENDING ORDINANCE 2024-04, THE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE FOR THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE, OHIO, AND AUTHORIZING THE FISCAL OFFICER TO TRANSFER FUNDS BETWEEN ACCOUNTS TO SATISFY THE VILLAGE'S AGREED UPON SHARE OF THE STATE ROUTE 316 PAVING PROJECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Roger Clark moved, seconded by Dave Rainey, to have the Third Reading. After the reading, Dave Rainey moved, seconded by Colton Henson to accept the Third Reading, and adopt as an emergency measure. All votes were yay.

After the reading, Colton Henson moved, seconded by Chad Noggle, to accept the First Reading, suspend the Rules of Council, waive the Second and Third Readings, and adopt as an emergency measure. All votes were yay.

Dave Rainey moved, seconded by Colton Henson, to post NO PARKING signs across from Kellie Jo's from Dime Alley to Long Street. All votes were yay.

At 6:46 PM, Dave Rainey moved, seconded by Colton Henson, to adjourn the meeting. All votes were yay and the meeting adjourned.
