ASHVILLE COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION

Held: MAY 19, 2025

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The Council of Ashville convened in Regular Session from 6:29 PM to 6:54 PM in the Charles K. Wise Council Chambers at 200 East Station Street, Ashville, Ohio 43103. Mayor Welsh called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and requested a moment of silence.

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

WATER: Jim Welsh reported that there were problems at the water plant causing the water levels to drop in the towers. Bert Cline said that he reached out to the deveolpers and instructed them to not water sod until the water levels were back to normal. Welsh stated that South Bloomfield assisted with supplying water and extended a big thanks for their help.

TAX: Martina Wrighsel introduced herself and reported that she is currently working to get residents at the apartments who haven't registered with the Tax Department registered and caught up on unfiled returns and unpaid taxes.

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR: Bert Cline reported that DHL has refused to join the NCA. Cline noted that DHL has grants available to them but, unless they join the NCA, he isn't going to sign off on those grants.
