

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

ASHVILLE COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION

Held: MAY 5, 2025

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The Council of Ashville convened in Regular Session from 6:29 PM to 6:54 PM in the Charles K. Wise Council Chambers at 200 East Station Street, Ashville, Ohio 43103. Mayor Welsh called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and requested a moment of silence.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Roger Clark moved, seconded by Randy Loveless, to approve the minutes for the April 21, 2025 Regular Session as presented. All votes were yay.

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

POLICE: Lt. Cline reported that they are still working on hiring officers.

STREET: Greg Sturgill reported that street sweeping will be Thursday of that week. Council asked what happens to vehicles that aren't moved. Lt. Cline said they were ticketed in the past but that has since stopped. Colton Henson asked what kind of notification residents are given prior to street sweeping. Sturgill said signs are posted. April Grube said notification is also printed in the newsletter and website. Henson said he would like to have several days notice to give people more time to prepare.

Roger Clark asked if there was anything the department could do about the potholes. Bert Cline said that someone has already been hired to address the matter.

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR: Bert Cline reported that the OWDA approved the additional funding needed to complete Phase 1 of the South Metershed Project. Cline also reported that he and Samantha Pemberton are working with Nexus Lexis to create a policies and procedures program. The software will provide training videos and keep the Village up-to-date with current HR issues.
