ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The academic program is organized on a rotating "A" day" "B" day block schedule. Eight blocks per semester with seven credits per semester being the maximum course load. Students attend four blocks daily equaling seven 89-minute courses and one study hall for the year. Block scheduling was instituted in 1993.

SPECIAL CURRICULUM FEATURES

Academies of Loudoun (ACL) - The mission of the Academies of Loudoun is to empower students to explore, research, collaborate, innovate, and to make meaningful contributions to the world in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. A separate ACL school profile will be included for all students who attend the Academies of Loudoun. ACL offers three programs:

- **Academy of Engineering and Technology (AET)** – This is an integrated program of 9th & 10th grade students with a strong STEM focus. Students are selected through a competitive admissions process. AET classes receive a weight of .5.
- **Academy of Science (AOS)** – This program offers an extremely rigorous intergrade math and science program for students selected through a competed admission process. AOS classes received a weight of .5.
- **Monroe Advanced Technical Academy (MATA)** – offers advanced technical training to include industry-standard certifications and licensures as well as college credit through articulation agreements.

Dual Enrollment (DE) – students may select from classes at Northern Virginia Community College or other area colleges to earn both college and high school credit. Dual enrollment course receives a weight of 1.0.

Virtual Distance Learning (V) – courses are taken online

The North Star School (TNSS) – TNSS is a non-traditional education program specially designed for high school students who need an accelerated pathway to meet on-time graduation.

Advanced Placement (AP) – contains at least first year college level work. Students may receive college credit from post-secondary institutions through completion of AP exams. AP courses receive a weight of 1.0.

Honors (H) – most rigorous: exceeds grade level norms. Honors courses receive a wight of .5.

Academic (A) – demanding often exceeds grade level norms.

GPA CALCULATION AND LATIN HONORS

GPA Calculation and Latin Honors Grade point average includes all classes for which high school credit bearing courses were earned or could have been earned. Advanced Placement, Dual Enrollment, and International Baccalaureate classes are given a weight at 1.0. High school Honors classes are weighted at 0.5. Beginning with the class of 2025, Loudoun County Public school will utilize the Latin Honors system to acknowledge student achievement, with distinctions including Summa Cum Lau
