STUDENT & PARENT

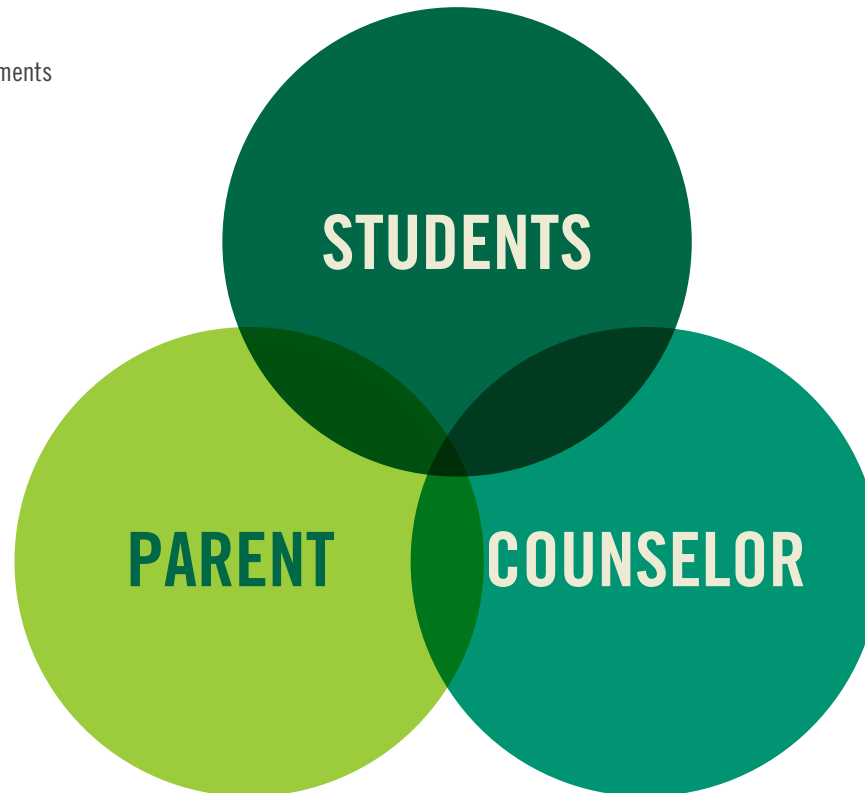
- Review college websites, admission requirements
- Narrow list: 4-8 target schools
- Tour campuses on shortlist
- Research scholarships
- Rehearse mock interview
- Discuss finances
- Review applications, pay fees, submit

PARENT

- Offer encouragement
- Remind about upcoming deadlines
- Understand average college costs
- Plan campus tours
- Ask student to clean up social media
- Assist with FAFSA and other forms
- Proofread (don't write) essays
- Confirm medical records are current

EVERYBODY

- Meet to discuss student's college readiness
- Understand admission requirements
- Meet deadlines
- Maintain lines of communication



PARENT & COUNSELOR

- Establish a timeline
- Suggest best-fit majors
- Assess “hidden-gem” schools
- Understand financial aid
- Know the real costs of each college

STUDENTS

- Work hard in challenging classes
- Seek leadership roles in extracurriculars
- Study for and take the SAT/ACT
- Create a “brag sheet”
- Attend college fairs
- Request admission materials from colleges
- Ask for letters of recommendation, send thank-you notes
- Write, rewrite college essay
- Complete applications

STUDENT & COUNSELOR

- Know pros/cons of early decision
- Review local and niche scholarships
- Understand campus culture
- Plan ways to stand out from the crowd
- Know requirements for safe, target and reach schools

COUNSELOR

- Advise on academics
- Write letters of recommendation
- Send school reports, transcripts
- Provide financial aid, scholarship info
- Suggest college fairs, campus tours
- Connect child with students at target schools
- Recommend appropriate colleges
- Advocate for applicants
