#### **Project Summary**

**Brevard Public Schools** 

Brevard Public Schools is seeking funding under the K-12 Civic Literacy Booklist Program to promote districtwide content engagement and support student acquisition of civic knowledge. By purchasing approved books on the *K-12 Civic Literacy Booklist Prioritization Chart* and distributing to all elementary, middle, and high schools, Brevard Public Schools can increase the collective capacity of our students to become contributing members of society, while aligning learning opportunities to the new B.E.S.T. Standards. Once schools have access to each book listed on the prioritization table for the grade levels served, funding shall also be used to purchase selections from the *Florida's B.E.S.T Standards: ELA K-12 Civic Reading List*, as permitted within the program. Specific items to be purchased are outlined on the table below and corresponding budget narrative. The timeline for implementation of initiatives under this program is immediately following receipt of the project award.

#### Charter Schools

Charter schools within Brevard County were notified of the K-12 Civic Literacy Booklist Program on December 4, 2020, including their specified allocation, program requirements, and the book list for approved program purchases. Signed assurances that charter school purchases shall be in accordance with the booklist prioritization chart have been completed and collected from charter school officials. The LEA shall retain evidence to document appropriate use of all program funds for charter schools.

#### Private schools

Private schools within Brevard County were notified of the K-12 Civic Literacy Booklist Program on December 3, 2020, including their option to participate, specific program requirements, and the book list for approved program purchases. Signed assurances that private school purchases shall be in accordance with the booklist prioritization chart have been completed and collected from participating private school officials. The LEA shall maintain control of program funds, as required, and retain evidence to document appropriate use of all program funds for participating private schools.

#### **Fiscal Controls**

The LEA will provide programmatic and fiscal oversight to ensure all program expenditures meet program guidelines. Brevard Public Schools has the fiscal capacity and proven fiscal management required to effectively administer the K-12 Civic Literacy Booklist Program. The Department of Elementary Leading and Learning, Secondary Leading and Learning, and Financial Services will consult for program and budget adherence to all required and/or regulatory guidelines. Each Brevard public charter schools shall receive the designated program allocation and participating private schools shall be recipients of equitable services. Note that the

currently approved DOE620 for Brevard Public Schools and General Assurances for Participation in State and Federal Programs are on file with FDOE and no changes exist.

#### **Budget Narrative**

Brevard Public Schools' allocation of \$110,939.76 shall cover costs for approved program purchases, including the specified allocation to each charter school and the provision of equitable services for private schools electing to participate. As outlined on the DOE101S, the budget costs are requested for:
