function and object string into the 5100/730 function and object string. We are moving these funds in order to fund registration costs for our extracurricular teams instead of the approved activity of funding travel costs.

BPS will be removing the previously approved Conscious Discipline Teacher Training activity and reallocating those funds into new activities. BPS has a dedicated team of teachers that bring STEM lessons and materials into K-12 classrooms to infuse STEM in all subjects and support teachers with the integration process. We will be increasing funding for our Technology Integrators with STEM and Robotics materials for integration in K-12 classrooms. We will purchase computers, peripherals, iPads, and iPad carts for our Technology Integration team to infuse STEM lessons in K-12 classrooms.

Updated Middle School CTE computer labs are needed to run the software required for students to obtain digital tools and industry certifications in the content area. These labs are outdated, and do not have needed specifications for optimal use by the students. Enhanced performance of the machines is required to best support the students in their CTE programs. Testing cannot be done effectively and reliably in the current labs in these classrooms. BPS will purchase new computers and peripherals for these labs.

iPads and laptops for STEM integration in K-12 classrooms. During the summer of 2023, this team of integrators will be using the iPads and laptops purchased to train teachers in effective ways to integrate this technology into their classrooms.

To support hands-on STEM learning, one portion of Brevard Public Schools' June 2023 Summer STEM camp will include instruction on unmanned aerial systems, commonly referred to as drones. To maximize student engagement, small teams of five students will work with a Raspberry PiHawk drone kit to build a programmable drone from the ground up. To accommodate the 400 students, we plan to enroll across four campuses (Stone Middle School, Cocoa Jr/Sr High School, Madison Middle School, and Southwest Middle School) 80 Raspberry PiHawk kits will be needed (4 per class x 5 classes per campus x 4 campuses). Each kit costs \$899. Budget request is for \$71,920 to procure 80 of the kits.

We will also be purchasing materials for our theater programs. These programs are drastically underfunded and have activities throughout the calendar year that need materials to provide improved access to academic success. The equipment we will be purchasing for our Theater program will be used June and July of 2023 in our Summer Fine Arts Program. We have a robust theater community in Brevard and our summer arts program is always full of amazing talent and productions. This summer we will be putting on productions of Pippin and Matilda with students in all facets including a full orchestra at all productions. We plan to purchase individual wireless microphone packs, microphones, and microphone stands due to a higher enrollment of students than expected and increased performances. We plan to purchase portable folding stage sets to space the students out on stage based upon need of the production. We also plan to purchase audio equipment to increase the capabilities of increased microphone presence. These summer programs need these items to properly engage students executing these productions.
