Project Abstract: BPS has utilized all data platforms to include the new FAST Progress Monitoring Data to identify students that would benefit from additional instruction. Through two programs the district will be able to provide direct and supportive instruction to students in both elementary and secondary settings. Our most high need elementary schools will host a robust after school program to increase student achievement and support positive connection to school while high need secondary schools will host supplemental instruction on Saturdays.

Program Development and Design:

Program 1: Elementary After School STEM Program for 10 Tier II Elementary Schools (University Park, Fairglen, Sherwood, Imperial Estates, Discovery, Westside, Columbia, Pinewood, Challenger 7, and Atlantis). The after-school program will be STEM focused to include Robotics and Snap Circuit Activities. Students will additionally receive support in the BEST Standards for Math and ELA through the use of supplemental materials and manipulatives included in the State Adopted Instructional Materials. The after-school programs will run 5 days a week for the 2023 and 2024 school year at no cost to families. Students who are experiencing homelessness or foster placement will be given priority in accessing the program.

Program 2: Academic Support Saturday School will be hosted at 6 sites geographically located throughout the county to support remediation, acceleration, and college access. Certified teachers will provide instruction on the standards for BEST Math, BEST ELA, Science, and Social Studies. All students will be welcome to attend however those whose data on the FAST Progress Monitoring tool indicate below grade level performance will receive personal invitations as part of their individualized growth plans. Students who are experiencing homelessness or foster placement will be given priority in accessing the program. Students who have been retained or at-risk for retention will be able to work in a credit retrieval platform. Certified teachers will utilize the state adopted instructional materials to provided accelerated and remediated support. Sites will also provide support in college and career access through SAT/ACT Readiness, support in industry certifications, IB, AICE, and AP Exams and help sessions for dual enrollment students. Each site will host a parent orientation session with strategies to amplify support at home.

Evaluation of Effectiveness:

Program 1: A program manager will monitor daily attendance, FAST Progress Monitoring, and academic achievement data for students who participate in the program. Students and parents will also have the opportunity to provide feedback in a survey.

Program 2: A program manager will monitor daily attendance, FAST Progress Monitoring, and course related academic achievement data for students who participate in the program. Students and parents will also have the opportunity to provide feedback in a survey.
