F) Narrative

In order to expend ESSER I before ESSER II we will have to adjust some of our funds that were budgeted for 2 years to cover some of our other expenses incurred due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the ongoing academic, behavioral, and mental health supports that have been put in place to support our students.

First, we will cover the cost of an extended day at the secondary level. The day was extended because of switching to block scheduling to reduce transitions and time in the hallways where students would be in close contact with each other. It also allowed students to complete 8 classes in the school year instead of 7, which allowed for credit recovery for some students who had difficulty at the onset of distance learning at the end of the 19-20 school year.

Second, we will cover the salary of Teachers on Assignment in 14 of our schools. Teachers on Assignment provide various supports to their schools by assisting with student behaviors, academic supports, and supporting teacher and administrative needs specific to their school environment.

Edited to add for 5100/120 we are using a combination of item 11 activities 2,3, and 4.
