#### EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT, TEACHING AND LEARNING

#### EARLY CHILDHOOD HEALTH AND WELLNESS

The environmental health and safety specialist (EH&S) visits classrooms monthly, or more if needed, to ensure all classrooms are following health and safety regulations and meets regularly with the Head Start director. Classrooms are receiving additional support with de-cluttering.

Health services staff continue supporting families with obtaining current physical exams and immunizations. The dental hygienist provided case management to families with children who required follow up oral health care.

In collaboration with education staff, health services staff supported teaching teams with implementing a new toothbrushing procedure.

#### ERSEA/PARENT FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (PFCE)


