The 21st CCLC program provides opportunities during non-school hours for academic enrichment, including providing tutorial services to help students who experience significant barriers to successfully improve their academic achievement and social emotional well-being.

The 21st CCLC program, along with community partners, delivers hands-on academic and personal enrichment opportunities to each student enrolled in our programs. Students will have daily academic activities that include enhanced learning opportunities, mentoring, remediation, homework help and tutoring services that will align with the new GPRA outcome measures.

The 21st CCLC offers an array of PBL activities that are influenced by the real world and specifically ties to our community, student interest, and the new GPRA outcome measures. Additional services are offered such as youth development activities, service learning, nutrition and health education, drug and violence prevention programs, arts, music, physical fitness and wellness programs, technology education programs, financial literacy, financial literacy.

This is a free program for families; however, the focus of this program is to provide expanded academic enrichment opportunities. Meaningful and rigorous academic and personal enrichment activities provide an extension to the school day. Workshops and services designed to demonstrate ways families can positively impact their child's academic success are provided for adult family members. Activities aligned to the objectives promote engagement of students by improving academic performance, personal enrichment, behavior, problem solving, knowledge of healthy lifestyle choices, and engagement in cultural activities.
