

## 4<sup>th</sup> Science and 4<sup>th</sup> Social Studies Substitutions/Waivers

### Course Substitutions

The 4<sup>th</sup> science and 4<sup>th</sup> social studies credit may be fulfilled by courses designated by the Course Code Directory as being in either the science or social studies subject area. To provide students more flexibility in meeting their individual program of study, the following has been approved as substitutions for the 4<sup>th</sup> science and 4<sup>th</sup> social studies credit. Please note that some substitutions are based on a course by course equivalency while others require successful completion of three (3) CTE courses in a sequential program in order to substitute for the 4<sup>th</sup> science or 4<sup>th</sup> social studies course. Please refer to the table below.

The 4<sup>th</sup> science and 4<sup>th</sup> social studies credit requirement may also be fulfilled by the following:

- Science and social studies courses designated by the course code directory as fulfilling the state science or social studies requirement
- Dual enrollment science or social studies, excluding those used to fulfill graduation requirements, included on the *Dual Enrollment Course – High School Subject Area Equivalency List*
- Courses listed in a postsecondary catalog that fulfill the requirements for history/social science courses for an Associate of Arts degree may be used to fulfill the 4<sup>th</sup> social studies credit requirement

### Course Waivers

In addition to the approved substitutions, on a case by case basis, a waiver may be submitted for a student unable to fulfill the fourth credit requirements for science and social studies due to the need for Intensive Reading, 1000410, classes. The 11<sup>th</sup> grade *Intensive Reading* course is infused with *science content* and the 12<sup>th</sup> grade *Intensive Reading* course will be infused with *social studies* content.
