Project Summary

As of result of the pandemic, local needs continue to shift and diligence to address existing and emerging needs is paramount. Data consistently indicates that the impact of disproportionate achievement associated with subgroups, including the heightened population of hybrid and elearners, is being exacerbated by the pandemic. Traditionally successful students are also faced with unfamiliar challenges, requiring dedicated resolve and the effective utilization of student progress monitoring data to identify and address the needs of all learners. The significance of these outcomes cannot be understated; thus, the current educational environment requires defined plans to collect, analyze, and disseminate data, including targeted and accessible stakeholder training on data interpretation, pattern recognition, and factors that best predict success. More than ever, educators are tasked with understanding and applying data in innovative ways to ensure that all students are successful during this unparalleled time. Districts must purposefully build their collective capacity to leverage data for promoting student achievement.

Brevard Public Schools is privileged to employ a highly skilled Performance Data Analyst (referred to as the Data Scientist in the remainder of the application) who provides districtwide leadership in the development, maintenance, and implementation of methodically rigorous performance data analyses. Note that the Brevard Public Schools' Data Scientist exceeds the state's recommended qualifications in all domains. The Data Scientist utilizes Brevard's extensive suite of student performance data to discern LEA needs, convert data into usable formats for stakeholders, and communicate areas of improvement with school and district staff. By continuing to fund the Data Scientist position through this initiative, Brevard Public Schools seeks to ensure that stakeholders at both the district and school level have appropriate tools to make informed, data-driven decisions, and efficacy to use data for improving school and student outcomes. These supports include access to comprehensive, customized data reports including student-specific, cohort, Multi-tier System of Supports (MTSS), Progress Monitoring Plan (PMP), and critical at-risk indicators such as early warning and dropout prevention data. In

addition to ensuring stakeholder access to rich, customized data, the Data Scientist analyzes student, school, and district achievement/assessment data, interprets results, prepares reports, and communicates with applicable stakeholders to enhance understanding of student learning outcomes and the use of progress monitoring to close achievement gaps.

Project Design

Brevard Public Schools

Consistent with the State of Florida's education priorities, Brevard Public Schools will incorporate multiple strategies to build districtwide capacity for closing achievement gaps between subgroups. To this end, project activities include several distinct areas of focus. Central to addressing this goal is the continuous collaboration between the Data Scientist and leaders at the district and school level, in both an advisory capacity through the provision of targeted progress monitoring support and guidance, as well as through facilitation of tailored professional development to address identified gaps in student achievement. Using appropriate quantitative and statistical tools, the Data Scientist shall conduct unique analyses of student, school, and district performance data, demonstrate proficiency in presenting data to a variety of stakeholders, including district leaders, school leaders, and teachers, and assist in establishing specific performance benchmarks and programs with assessment and accountability components.

Additionally, the Data Scientist shall conduct ongoing in-service training for school and district staff in data collection techniques, the utilization of data to enhance the instructional process, and the robust analytics that are available to identify learner needs within Brevard Public School's sophisticated data dashboard, PowerSchool Performance Matters.

Another key responsibility of Brevard Public Schools' Data Scientist is to collaborate with FDOE and serve as the primary point of contact to provide requested progress monitoring data. Consistent with the requirements of the program, the Data Scientist shall collaborate on strategic initiatives, attend and participate in all scheduled meetings pertaining to the program, assist with the timely and accurate completion and submission of reports, and cooperatively serve as the liaison to state-level entities.

The timeline for implementation of all initiatives under this program is ongoing. As the Data Scientist is an *existing* position within Brevard Public Schools, the described practices are established and will continue through the duration of the program period. With respect to the provision of progress monitoring data to FDOE, the LEA shall await specific guidance on the department's Data Scientist expectations and update internal processes to align with requirements upon receipt.

Charter Schools

Charter schools within Brevard County all have access to and utilize the same data information system (Performance Matters) as Brevard Public Schools. In collaboration with charter schools, the Data Scientist will make available the same support that is provided to the public schools under this program. As available to Brevard Public Schools, these supports include access to comprehensive, customized data reports including student-specific, cohort, Multi-tier System of Supports (MTSS), Progress Monitoring Plan (PMP), and critical at-risk indicators such as early warning and dropout prevention data. In addition to ensuring access to rich, customized data, the Data Scientist analyzes student, school, and district achievement/assessment data, interprets results, prepares reports, and communicates with applicable stakeholders to enhance understanding of student learning outcomes and the use of progress monitoring to close achievement gaps. All trainings that are made available on analyzing data to close the achievement gap, or in association with this program, will also be available to charter school participants.

Private schools

Private school participants will have access to any training provided by the Data Scientist in association with this program, as well as individualized assistance in preparing and analyzing data reports to inform instructional decisions and close achievement gaps, as requested by private school officials. Private schools will need to provide access to the data and work in collaboration with the Data Scientist, which shall be discussed in consultation with private school officials. Private schools will communicate directly with the Data Scientist to schedule consultations, share and analyze data, and/or request other applicable assistance.

Fiscal Controls

The LEA will provide programmatic and fiscal oversight to ensure program expenditures meet program guidelines. Brevard Public Schools has the fiscal capacity and proven fiscal management required to effectively administer the Data-Informed Supports Program. The Department of Secondary Leading and Learning and Financial Services will consult for program and budget adherence to all required and/or regulatory guidelines. Brevard public charter and private schools will be recipients of equitable services from the Brevard Public Schools' Data Scientist, with the LEA retaining control of program funds, as required. Note that the currently approved DOE620 for Brevard Public Schools is on file with FDOE and no changes exist.

Budget Narrative

The allocation of \$88,000.00 shall cover costs associated with the continued employment of Brevard Public Schools' Data Scientist, including the provision of equitable services for participating public charter and private schools. As outlined on the DOE101S, budget costs are requested for:
