

FOCUS Site Maintenance


November 20th & 21st FOCUS will be doing site maintenance and access may be limited one those two days (during Thanksgiving Break). Full access will be restored following that time period.

MOBILE RESPONSE TEAM

24 Hours 7 Days a Week

The Mobile Response Team (MRT) provides free on-demand and on-site crisis intervention services to children and families in Brevard County 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Services are provided by multi-disciplinary teams of licensed and master leveled behavioral health professionals with specialized crisis intervention training.

SERVICES:

- · Services are Free
- Target response time within 60 minutes or less
- Evaluation and Assessment
- Development of Safety or Crisis Plans
- · Stabilization Services
- Supportive Crisis Counseling
- Education
- Development of Coping Skills
- Development of Care Plan
- Linkage to Appropriate Resources
- Care Coordination

Eligibility:

MRT serves youth or young adult ages 25 and under.

The MRT is designed to address a wide variety of situations to include, suicidal and homicidal behaviors, drug and alcohol abuse, disruptive behaviors related to thought, mood and anxiety disorders, individuals displaying hallucinations, family/peer conflicts, and escalating behaviors without immediate intervention, the individual is likely to require a higher intensity of services.

MRT is available to anyone who calls for assistance: Parent, Relative, Foster Family, School/Medical Personnel, Child and Adult Protection Staff, and Law Enforcement.
