

Criteria Considered for Cambridge

There are two paths to take

Single Class Track

- Take a class in your area of strength and interest
- All courses earn High School credit
- Earn higher weight on your GPA
- Work with college level material (*excellent preparation*)
- College Credit (*upon passing exam*)
- Evidence of rigor on your transcript for college admissions

Diploma Track

- 7 classes with “like minded” students
- Higher weight on your GPA
- Minimum of 21 college credits (*upon passing exams*)
- Qualify for highest Bright Futures Scholarship when paired with 100 hours of community service
- Evidence of rigor on your transcript for college admissions

Applications

- Applications are required for school of choice admission.

AICE Curriculum

AICE Diploma Option

Diploma candidates must earn seven credits from examinations, including one from each of groups 1, 2, 3 as well as Global Perspectives.

Group 1 – Maths & Sciences

- Biology (AS & A Level)*

- Chemistry

- Environmental Management

- Marine Science (AS & A Level)**

- Mathematics (AS & A Level)

- Psychology

Group 2 - Languages

- English Language (AS & A Level)

- Spanish Language

Group 3 – Arts & Humanities

- English Literature (AS & A Level)

- Environmental Management

- European History

- US History

- History (A Level)

- Music

- Business

- Media Studies (AS & A Level)

- Psychology

- Sociology (AS & A Level)**

Group 4 - Interdisciplinary

- General Paper

- Thinking Skills

Global Perspectives must be taken for diploma eligibility.

* AS is the 1st year and A Level is the 2nd year
**candidates may sit for both AS & A level exams in a single year

AICE at Heritage

- Students who earn the AICE Diploma and complete the necessary 100 hours of community service qualify for the Florida Bright Futures Academic Scholars Award which pays tuition up to a bachelor's degree at any state public university.

- Candidates can earn college credit for each AICE exam they pass.

- AICE teachers at HHS receive training by the University of Cambridge.

- The AICE diploma allows students to be flexible in the selection of their academic and elective courses.

- 9th grade students are generally enrolled in Pre-AICE courses which prepare them for the rigor of full AICE classes.

- AICE courses are primarily taken in the 10th through 12 grades.

- Students with exceptional academics and FSA scores can be fast-tracked as 'Super Freshmen' and may begin full AICE courses their 9th grade year.

AICE

The Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) program is a rigorous program of academic study overseen by the University of Cambridge. The program has been in existence for more than 150 years and is offered in over 160 countries across the globe.



AICE provides:

- A flexible curriculum and focus on student strengths.
- Detailed knowledge of subject areas.
- Development of student skills such as thinking skills, oral and written skills, and problem solving abilities
- A pre-university curriculum and examination system that helps prepare students for success at the college level
