Communication is Key!

Title I

The program provides <u>supplemental</u> funds to meet educational goals. In addition, it requires schools to train parents on how to support their children academically at home and requires parents to have an active role in their child's academic achievement.



"PBIS is an evidence-based tiered framework for supporting students' behavioral, academic, social, emotional, and mental health. It is a way to create positive, predictable, equitable, and safe learning environments."

All staff teach students each of the expectations. Based on these expectations we have developed agreements for all common areas. These agreements serve as guidelines for behavior. We use PBIS to prevent challenging behaviors from occurring by encouraging and rewarding positive behavior.

Expected Behavior from Students and School Employees

Brevard Public Schools expects students and employees to conduct themselves in keeping with their levels of development and maturity. Proper regard for authority, the rights and welfare of students, school staff, respect for the educational purposes underlying all school activities and providing proper care of school facilities, school buses, and equipment is expected at all times.

The Brevard Public School Board is committed to providing a safe, secure, positive, productive, and nurturing educational environment that is <u>free from bullying and/or harassment of any kind</u> for all of its students, employees, volunteers, parents, and school visitors.

<u>BULLYING / HARRASSMENT</u> (Brevard County Policy 5517.01)

Aggressive behavior, bullying and/or harassment toward a student, employee, volunteer, or visitor whether by other students, staff employees, or third parties is strictly **prohibited and will not be tolerated.** This prohibition includes physical, verbal, and psychological abuse. The Board will not tolerate any gestures, comments, threats, or actions, which causes or threatens to



cause bodily harm or personal degradation. This policy applies to all activities on school property, in route to or from school-sponsored activities and those occurring off school property such as any school-sponsored, school-approved or school-related activity or function, where students are under the school's control. **Bullying and/or harassment will not be tolerated and disciplinary action will be taken**. In addition to school consequences, criminal charges may also be filed.



It is important to distinguish between <u>rude</u>, <u>mean</u>, and <u>bullying</u> so that teachers, school administrators, police, youth workers, parents, and children all know what to pay attention to and when to intervene. If we classify rudeness and mean behavior as bullying, then we run the risk of the word bullying losing its urgency.

- Rude = Inadvertently saying or doing something that hurts someone else.
- Mean = Purposefully saying or doing something to hurt someone once (or maybe twice).
- Bullying = Intentionally aggressive behavior, repeated over time, that involves an imbalance of power.




DRESS STANDARDS

Parents may be called to bring a change of clothing or footwear for their child if dress code is violated.



<u>Head</u>: Extreme hairstyles, hair colors, or make-up that is disruptive or does not allow direct eye contact is prohibited (i.e. Mohawks, faux hawks, shaved head art, hair covering the eyes, etc.) No hats or sunglasses worn inside.







Shoes: For safety purposes, students **must** wear sneakers daily (No Slides, No Crocs, No Slippers). Students participate in 30 minutes of wellness and/or PE class each day.



Shirts: Upper garments must adequately cover the neckline and waistline. Straps on permitted garments should be at least 1 1/2 inches wide.



Students are expected to follow the Brevard Public Schools' dress code. Please use good judgment when making attire choices.

HEALTH SAFETY



Clinic

The school has a clinic staffed by a nurse for students who are sick or injured. Parents are called if students are unable to return to class after some time in the clinic. These students should be checked out of school as there are no facilities available for children who are ill and possibly contagious. Your prompt response to this notification is appreciated.

Medication

STUDENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO BRING ANY TYPE OF MEDICINE TO SCHOOL. This

includes, but is not limited to aspirin, antihistamines, or cough drops. Medicine can only be given in the clinic with **written authorization** from the physician and parent or guardian. **Medication must be transported by the parent or guardian** to the clinic and be contained in the original prescription bottle.

Contact Updates

It is important that staff be able to contact you should your child become sick or injured. Please inform the school office and clinic when any changes in home, cell, or work phone numbers occur during the school year.

RAINY DAY PLAN

Parents are encouraged to work out, **in advance**, a rainy day transportation plan with their children. A mutual understanding between parent, child, and school will allow for a smooth transition during inclement weather. Rainy Day Plan Forms will be provided to you at the beginning of the school year. Be prepared for rain during the first week of school. Car traffic increases on rainy days. Please be patient and follow the directions of school personnel.

BREVARD COUNTY "30-30 RULE"

If the time between lightning and hearing thunder is <u>thirty</u> (30) <u>seconds or less</u>, the outdoor activity (including dismissal) shall be suspended immediately, and staff MUST wait <u>thirty</u> (30) <u>minutes or more</u> after thunder is last heard before allowing students to leave proper shelter.

Bicycles and Scooters

- Bicycles/scooters may not be ridden on school sidewalks at any time. All students must walk their bike or scooter at all times on campus.
- Walk bicycles/scooters across busy streets and obey crossing guards and safety patrols. No jay walking.
- Bicycle helmets are required by law. Children riding bikes to school must wear a helmet.
- <u>To prevent theft, all bikes must be locked during the school day.</u> Parents are strongly encouraged to register bicycle ID numbers and descriptions with the Police Department prior to the start of school. Missing or stolen bicycles should be reported to the Melbourne Police Department.

Bus Transportation

Bus transportation will be provided to all children who live more than 2 miles from the school. Students must be registered with transportation services in order to ride a bus.

- 1. Vehicle traffic will NOT be allowed in the bus lane in front of the school between 7:30 8:15 a.m. and 2:00 2:45 p.m. (12:45 1:45 p.m. on Early Release Days). This will ensure safety for all while the buses are loading and unloading students.

- 3. It is important that parents read and discuss the rules of the bus behavior standards with their children.

Suspension From Bus Transportation

The same behavior that is expected in school is expected on the bus. Students receiving a discipline referral from the bus will be given corrective strategies which correlate with the district-wide discipline plan.

Visitor and Volunteer Information

Croton Elementary welcomes all visitors and volunteers onto the campus with proper identification. Anyone wishing to be on school property during school hours <u>must use their Driver License/State ID</u> to sign in at the front office. A system was put into place by the Brevard Public School District that conducts a National Sex Offender Registry at sign-in. This is in direct response to the community's request for improved security in our schools. To ensure the safety of our children, all visitors and volunteers must undergo certain safety checks. A badge with the visitor/volunteer's legal name will be printed to be worn on an <u>upper garment visible to staff</u> and students. This safety requirement is in place so that School Staff are aware of who is on campus at all times. According to School Board Policy po8475, visitors must be escorted on campus at all times.

Volunteers play an important role in the daily operations of Brevard Public Schools. We appreciate all the help our volunteers give our students, teachers, and schools. There are many ways to help; Registered Volunteers are welcome to come on campus to read with students, chaperone on field trips, support in the classroom with activities, and utilize our workroom to help with teacher projects, sorting fundraiser orders, and more. Attendance Counts

In order for students to receive quality instruction, it is essential that they attend school and are on time each day. The importance of regular school attendance is emphasized by the Florida Compulsory School Attendance Law and Brevard Public Schools' Board Rules. School attendance is the responsibility of the parent and student. Students may not be absent more than **nine days** in a semester in order to be promoted to the next grade level.

Excused Absences Excused absences include a doctor's visit, court appearance, or religious holiday; in order to be excused, appropriate documentation is required. Students who remain absent without proper authorization will be referred to the Attendance Resource Officer. Parents are requested to call the office before 8:30 a.m. to report their child absent from school.

Encouraging Good Attendance

Help your child get into the habit and learn the value of regular routines.

Teach your child that attending school is non-negotiable unless they are truly sick.

Build relationships with other families and discuss how you can help each other out (e.g., drop off or pick up children or babysitting) in times of need or emergencies.

Identify non-academic activities (drama, art, music, etc.) that can help motivate your child's interest in school and learning.

Screen time may have a harmful impact on your child's sleep habits. Even calm videos can disrupt a child's sleep. Make bedrooms device-free zones and keep off screens at least 30 to 60 minutes before bedtime.



Bedtime routines are important to develop healthy sleep patterns. Sleep deprivation negatively affects academic performance by impairing concentration and cognitive functions. You can help your children fall asleep by sticking to a healthy bedtime routine like:

- Take a bath and brush teeth
- Snuggle up and relax under a blanket
- Read books together
