Millage Increases Pending November 8 Election: Brevard and Nassau Millage will last four years unless it is extended by voters

<u>Fast Testing - Wedel</u>

(Florida Assessment of Student Thinking) This is done 3 times a year.. Testing began last week. Everything has gone well so far. The new test has taken much longer than the time allocated for the students. We will share this information with the district.

Parent and Family Engagement Plan (PFEP) Developmental Input - Wedel

Ms. Wedel (Title I Teacher) handed out last year's PFEP for everyone to look over. She reminded everyone that the PFEP is a road map for how families can be engaged in their child's education and how the school can support families with at-home learning. The PFEP is a living document reviewed and updated annually by all families, teachers, and administrators.

In addition, Ms. Wedel shared some of the results from the 2021 Spring Annual Parent Survey.

Results showed:

- 73% of families prefer to get important information through text message/ClassDojo.
- 56% of families prefer to get important information through letters/flyers sent home.
- 54% of families prefer to get important information through email.
- 70% of families prefer evenings (M-F) when attending a school event.
- 40% of families prefer immediately after school (M-F) when attending a school event.
- 77% of families say they would participate in or attend family fun nights.
- 43% of families say they would participate in or attend a reading strategies meeting.
- 43% of families say they would participate in or attend a homework help meeting.
- 42% of families say they would participate in or attend a math strategies meeting.
- 68% of families say they would use academic support materials for families to use at home.
- 46% of families prefer to provide input by completing a survey online.

Group Discussion

- Any suggestions on how we can better communicate with our families? Continue to use
 ClassDojo to communication back-and-forth between parents, teachers, and the whole
 school. In addition, SAC parents agreed that they like the sticker reminders that we put on
 the students the day of or before an event as a reminder.
- What topics would you be interested in learning more about during our Family/STEAM nights? SAC parents stated that they like the hands-on family nights, and maybe a math, art, or technology / coding night would be nice as well.
- Are there any suggestions you have on how family engagement can be strengthened at Cape View? SAC parents and teachers agreed that this year should be better with family engagement since events are allowed back on campus and parents are now allowed back on campus during lunch time to eat with their child.

Ms. Wedel shared that her and Mrs. Travers (Gifted/Title I Teacher) have been discussing when our first Family Night / Annual Title I Meeting will be and that the focus of that night will be geared toward science, which is an area of need on our SIP this year.
