How are parents and families informed of their rights?	Brevard Public Schools Office of Title I provides all Title I schools with a brochure informing parents of their rights. This brochure is sent home with all students via backpack. Schools are also required to have a copy of the "Parents Right To Know" letter in a parent and family engagement notebook kept in the front office. The district Title I office monitors and keeps documentation of this on file.
What barriers will you address to encourage parents/families to attend?	According to the Brevard Public Schools Elementary Parent Survey, 77% of our families prefer to get important information through text message. This year, Cape View will be utilizing FOCUS to effectivity share information about events and to provide individual student progress. In addition, 73% of our families prefer evenings (M-F) when attending a school event, so we will continue to have most of our school events in the evenings.
How will you get feedback from parents and families about the meeting?	Families are given a paper survey during our Title I Annual Meeting that encourages them to provide valuable feedback regarding the Title I program at Cape View Elementary. In addition, we post the presentation online and ask families to complete a Google Form Survey where they can provide feedback / input on this year's Title I Programs. Spanish copies of the survey are provided at the annual meeting and are also provided on line as well.
How do parents and families who are not able to attend receive information from the meeting?	All information / presentations from our annual meeting are posted to our school website. We also keep a hard copy of the presentation in the front office in our parent resource notebook.

Title III-ESOL *District coordinator-Anne Skinner	Title I works collaboratively with the Title III program and staff to address the needs of our ESOL students and families. Cape View strives to provide families with school documents in their native language when needed and/or requested and provides families/students with an iPad to utilize Google Translate as needed. In addition, Cape View was recently granted an ESOL Instructional Assistant to help support our ESOL students and families. The IA position was posted in October 2023, but has not been filled.
Title IX-Homeless *District contact-Ivette Collado	Any Cape View students identified as families in transition are eligible for tutoring services paid for by district Title I funds if the students demonstrate academic deficiencies. The district also offers joint awareness trainings for staff and families, free backpacks full of supplies for students, and provides bus transportation for students to their home school.
FDLRS/ESE services	FDLRS provides diagnostic and instructional support services to staff members and to families of students with exceptionalities. FDLRS and the district Title I office work collaboratively to implement and evaluate various parent involvement initiatives and training opportunities. Joint professional development opportunities are provided for staff and training opportunities are offered to parents by the Office of Exceptional Education, Title I and FDLRS. At the school level, parents are informed of Title I services their child receives during conferences and/or meetings, and grade level MTSS Meetings are conducted monthly between teachers and our literacy coach to discuss individual student needs and Tier grouping / interventions.
Preschool Programs (Head Start/VPK)	Step FOURward /Voluntary Pre-kindergarten (VPK) Title I funding supplements our VPK program, allowing us to offer full day services for our VPK students and families. VPK families are invited to all schoolwide family involvement events, and we provide a Kindergarten Round-Up event to inform parents about kindergarten expectations and procedures.
SAC	During our SAC Meetings, SAC has the responsibility for developing, implementing, and evaluating the school level plans.

Cape View supplies all primary students with a red communication folder and all intermediate students with a school daily planner. We offer Parent/Teacher Conferences twice a year and utilize FOCUS to communicate individual student progress. We share important information through monthly newsletters, our school website, school marquee, school Facebook page, and FOCUS.

Letters are sent home with every student that has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who not state-certified in the subject area they are assigned. A copy of the letter and a list of the parents who receive the letter is kept on file as documentation.

During our Open House in August, parents will have the opportunity to visit their child's classroom to learn information regarding curriculum, achievement levels, assessments, and classroom expectations and procedures. In addition, we post the district links to all grade level expectations to our school website, which includes reading, math, science, and social studies objectives and how parents can help their child at home. Parents are also encouraged to sign-up for FOCUS to receive important school information and to monitor their child's progress throughout the school year.

Based on our Home Language Report, we provide information to families in the following languages: English and Spanish School informational flyers and documents that are uploaded to our school website and FOCUS can easily be translated through those programs. Cape View strives to provide families with school documents in their native language when needed and/or requested and school information that is sent home is translated in Spanish whenever possible. We provide the front office staff with an iPad to help communicate information with new families that speak a native language and provide teachers with an iPad during parent-teacher conferences that may need assistance with translating.

Cape View Elementary provides full opportunities for the participation of families with disabilities. We arrange school meetings at a variety of times, record school events to post online, conduct parent-teacher phone conferences when needed, and inform families of important school information on our school website, school Facebook page, FOCUS, and in monthly newsletters.

Cape View Elementary hosts several events that offer families the chance to be engaged (Title I Annual Meeting, Open House, Family Nights, etc.). Families can participate in their child's education by communicating with their child's teacher, attending conferences, and using FOCUS to monitor their child's progress. How will workshops/events for families be evaluated to determine their effectiveness?	At every workshop/event that Cape View provides to families, we collect feedback from all the participates to evaluate each family's thoughts and suggestions of the workshop/event offered. In addition, we collect sign-in sheets from all our workshops/events to calculate the number of families that participated. Lastly, at the end of the year, faculty, parents, and community members evaluate the family engagement events to determine return on investment.
How will the needs of families be assessed to plan future events?	Results of parent surveys and exit slips are collected from families and are reviewed throughout the year by the Title I Team to determine needed changes.
What are the barriers for parents and families to attend workshops/events and how do you overcome these? (transportation, translation, etc)	Based on last year's parent survey, parents expressed that they are not able to sometimes attend workshops/events because it was not scheduled at convenient times. On this same survey, 73% of families prefer evenings (M-F) when attending a school event. To help overcome this barrier, we have scheduled most of our family workshops/events during the evening hours. In addition, we post all information / presentations from our family nights, events, and meetings to our school website, which also helps provide translation to our families as needed. We also keep a hard copy of the presentations in the front office in our parent resource notebook.
How are flexible dates and times for meetings, events and/or workshops offered?	Cape View schedules meetings/events at varying times. For example, parent/teacher conferences can be scheduled at any time convenient for the parent. Our "Student of the Month" breakfast celebrations are scheduled for first thing in the morning, PTO meetings are scheduled for right after school and our SAC meetings follow right after, and "Family Nights" and musical performances are offered in the evening hours.

All information / presentations from our family nights, events, and meetings are posted to our school website. We also keep a hard copy of the presentations in the front office in our parent resource notebook.
