- 7. **Principal's Report: Staffing Vacancies** Most of them are IA positions two require Spanish fluency. One ESE assistant, one Literacy interventionist, one Kindergarten instructional position. Classrooms are still 20-21. Ms. Murphy reviewed the SIP plan with SAC members. **Youth Truth Survey** Glimpse into student voice. Murphy will send a link to everyone to see questions. Most favorable: instructional methods & academic challenge on last year. Lowest were belonging & engagement. We are working on peer-to-peer discourses. Verbage of conscious discipline help to build classroom culture. New practice when a student needs to be removed: wish well from classmates. Mini brain

start smart when student returns. Engagement: COVID really affected this. Teachers going back to turn and talk and circulating in classroom post COVID. Student discourse is also being addressed (state walk throughs). Affirmation **Updates** (Lyons): two practices that we did not meet for accreditation. Six months to fix but we have a goal for 90 days. Talk to Lyons about the two practices. Fundamental practice 6.1 is easy to fix – Corriveau organizes all tutoring – logs hours, teachers, students, etc. Fundamental practice 10.2 – Ops team did not have member from EFSC representation. Jolley — what is the advantage to being certified? More money & access to grant funding. Attendance & Retention: Progress Monitoring quarterly from state. Under state average for total disciplinary referrals – 53 students made up 83 referrals. 43 in and out of school suspensions. Eight% of students have referrals. Above the state average 28% of students have 5 or more absences. Unable to provide incentives for attendance at this time. Total # of students retained twice – 11 students. Three students received mid-year promotion after data analysis.

8. HUB news: Working on affirmation issues. Gave away 60+ Thanksgiving baskets and 40+ Basket Brigade baskets. Families prefer turkey as opposed to gift cards. Lots of needs right now. Portable update: Fence is up. Meeting with contractors in regard to additional construction. Hoping for ribbon cutting after Spring Break.
