Dear families,

Wednesday, February 3rd, would have been our 3rd annual Global School Play Day. After much consideration and wanting to stick to the original intent of GSPD we opted not to host the event THIS year. Global School Play Day is a grassroots effort created by educators in support of <u>unstructured playtime</u> for students around the world. As you know, school interactions are more <u>structured</u> than ever this year to keep everyone healthy.

How can you support GSPD at home:

- 2. **GET SOCIAL** Invite your friends to participate in a Global Play Day 2021. Light the fire so others will catch the vision of returning the gift of unstructured play to this generation by talking about it on social media. Write your own blog post encouraging your readers to join in on GSPD. Connect with the GSPD community by hashtagging your social media posts with #GSPD2021.
- **3. CALL FOR TOYS** The only restrictions: the toys may NOT require batteries or electricity. No devices. Give them some ideas, since today's kids rarely play and often own very few toys: board games, dolls, Legos, blocks, trucks, cars, racetracks, playing cards, empty cardboard boxes, markers, jigsaw puzzles, blankets (for forts), social games (charades, Pictionary, etc.). The only exception on the electronics rule would be a board game that has an electronic timer, an electronics play kit, or similar. How about taking your child out in the dirt to dig, explore and get messy? Share a story of something you played when you were a child.
- 4. PLAY! NO SCREENS NO STRUCTURE ALL DAY LONG

Allow your child to spread their toys out around the room or take them outside and just PLAY!

- Don't organize anything.
- Don't tell them how to play with the toys/games.
- Don't interfere with your child unless you see something that could potentially hurt them.
- Don't Leave Them Unsupervised as the day is unstructured by adults, but not unsupervised.

Other than taking a few pictures/videos, try to be invisible and let the kids play. This is a day of unstructured play, not playful parent planned. You will be amazed at what your kids come up with!

Florida KidCare

Free or Low-Cost Health and Dental Insurance for Kids

Your child and their siblings could be one of the 174,000 children eligible for completely free or low-cost health and dental insurance through Florida KidCare – even if one or both parents are working.

Approximately 2.3 million children rely on Florida KidCare for the head-to-toe coverage they need from birth through the end of age 18. Florida KidCare is designed to provide services to children at each stage of growth and development. Health and dental services are delivered through quality plans that offer a choice of local doctors, dentists, specialists, hospitals, pharmacies and other health care providers. Benefits include but are not limited to:

- Doctor Visits
- Check-ups
- Vision & Hearing
- Dental Care
- Hospital Stays
- Surgeries
- Immunizations
- Prescriptions
- Emergencies
- Mental Health Services

Florida KidCare includes free, subsidized and full-pay options based on a family's household size and annual income. Most families pay nothing at all for coverage, and many pay just \$15 or \$20 a month. Families who do not qualify for free or subsidized coverage may purchase a competitively priced full-pay plan.

Lawfully residing immigrant children are eligible without a waiting period, and parent immigration status will never be asked.

With no application fee and year-round enrollment, the time to apply is always now. Simply fill out the application, and Florida KidCare will match your child with the right option.
