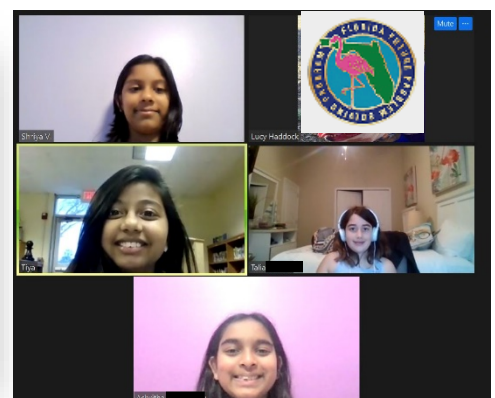

SafetyFirst

The Cocoa Beach Police Department has fielded a complaint reference traffic congestion on S. 4th Street during afternoon dismissal. We realize there is congestion during that time, but it's just the nature of the beast living near a school. I do have a few suggestions that I would appreciate you try to keep in mind when picking up your children from the North loop.

- 1.) As you approach the entrance to the loop, please treat the crosswalk and sidewalk as no parking zones. If you would, stop before the crosswalk and wait for the vehicles in the loop to pull up far enough to allow you to pull in enough so as not to block either the crosswalk or sidewalk. Please know that blocking either one of those is a violation of State Statute and there nothing I can do for you if a citation is issued. That is out of my hands.
- 2.) When you go to the back of the line to turn around, please use the cross streets to make a U-turn. Do not attempt to make the U-turn in the middle of the street. Regardless of your driving ability and size of vehicle you will not make that turn. It will require you to stop, back up in the street and then finish the turn. This is creating a traffic hazard and adding to the congestion.
- 3.) If you can't be here by 3:00 to get a spot inside the car loop, which is when it fills up, you may want to re-adjust you arrival time. If you can arrive between 3:30 and 3:40 that too could alleviate some congestion. In doing so you would not need to sit in a line for very long. Once the line starts moving it goes pretty quick so it really isn't that advantageous to line up and wait in that long line.
- 4.) Please continue to pull all the way over to the right on 4th Street. You are doing a great job of that but just wanted to mention it as a reminder.

Now for some other reminders. In order to ensure the safety of your children, in large part to the congestion and vehicle activity in the area at dismissal, we will NOT dismiss a child after 3:00. There will be no exceptions to this as our top priority is the safety of your children. So this means if you walk in at 3:01, the front office will not release your child and you will need to get in the appropriate car loop line according to your last name.

Also, as you know, we have two options for your children to be dismissed from school. Walkers/Bike riders and car loop pick up. Please utilize one of those options. Students will not be dismissed to the parking lot, so please don't park in the lot and hold up your number. It will NOT be entered in to the system until you are in the car loop. This again is for the safety of your children. There is too much activity and movement for us to be comfortable letting students cross the car loop lanes when vehicles are coming and going.

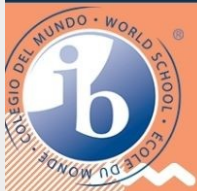
