The Need:

The Nshiri water project is located in the southeastern province of Rwanda and it serves 1,380 people. Their only source pooled in a mud pit that was requested by animals which contaminated the water. With this new well project, people can have access to clean water and not fear getting sick. They are very thankful for your generosity.

The Project:

- The construction of a new artesian water well provides clean water to the entire village.
- Concrete structures/basins and new pipes will ensure a constant flow of clean water and protect from animals and dirt and debris during the rainy season.
- The excess water runoff exits the concrete basin is used for irrigating crops in the nearby fields.
