Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) is a progress monitoring tool that will be administered three times per year to track your student's progress in learning the Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards throughout this school year. The purpose of this letter is to inform you that your student will participate in the first administration (PM1) of the **Grade 3-6** Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) Reading and Mathematics assessments on the morning sessions of the following days:

- Wednesday, September 14, 2022 Reading
- Thursday, September 15, 2022 Math

Please make an effort for your student to be present in school on these \underline{two} important days of state-wide testing.

Your student's results from PM1 are for informational purposes only, and your student's school will provide you with information about how to access the results after testing is completed.

FAST assessments are computer-adaptive tests taken on a computer or tablet. The questions get easier or more difficult depending on how the student responds, and each student will see different questions from a common item bank. Each test attempt (PM1, PM2, and PM3) will present 35–40 items that will cover the entire test "blueprint," meaning students will encounter items representative of the standards within the subject or grade level. If you or your student would like to interact with the online testing platform or review FAST Reading and Mathematics sample items at home, sample test materials are available at https://flfast.org/families.html.

Dear BPS Families,

In alignment with the Florida State Board of Education Ruling <u>6A.1.094124</u>, school districts are required to provide instruction in the following areas during the 2022-2023 school year:

- Five (5) hours of Mental Health Education for students in grades 6-12.
- Child Trafficking Prevention Education for students in grades K-12.
- Substance Use and Abuse Health Education for students in grades K-12.

Licensed mental health professionals, along with BPS staff certified in health education, physical education, school psychology, school counseling, and school social work, have developed lessons consisting of basic instruction aligned with Florida's Health Education Standards. Resources used for elementary schools may include Brevard Public Schools' Healthy Body Systems curriculum, Nemours Foundation for Kids, National Institute of Health, National Institute on Drug Abuse, Monique Burr Foundation, and curriculum from the annual "Red Ribbon Week, Say No to Drugs" campaign.

As we provide this basic instruction to students during the school day, we encourage all families to have ongoing conversations with their children about mental and emotional health and wellness. These lessons are designed to be developmentally appropriate for each grade level.
