WHAT IS TITLE I?

Title I is a federal grant that:

- Ensures all children have the opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach proficiency on challenging state academic standards and assessments
- Provides <u>supplemental</u> funds to school districts to assist schools with high concentrations of poverty to meet educational goals
- Requires schools to train parents on how to support their children academically at home
- Requires schools to train teachers on how to work effectively with parents and families in order to help improve academic achievement
- Requires parents to have an active role in their child's academic achievement

TITLE I FUNDING

- Districts allocate Title I funds to qualifying schools based on direct certification data
- Title I funds must supplement, not take the place of district funds
- A specified amount of Title I funds <u>must</u> be spent on family engagement. Parent input is critical so schools can provide trainings/events that are relevant to families
- Parents have the right to give input regarding how the school will use its Title I funds

WHO DECIDES HOW FUNDS ARE USED?

- Your administrative team considers data and feedback collected throughout the school year to write the school's Title I Plan. The team at Harbor City Elementary consists of Ms. Boyd, Ms. Lanterman, Mr. Tingle
- Use of Title I funds <u>must</u> align with the goals of the School Improvement Plan (SIP).
- Every school has a School Advisory Council (SAC) composed of:
 - parents, teachers, staff, community members, administrators, and students (at middle and high schools)
- The School Advisory Council helps determine how to use Title I funds. <u>Please consider joining we need your voice!</u>
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Copies of the Title I Plan and the School Improvement Plan (SIP) are available for families in the Title I Parent Notebook in the front office.

TITLE I PROGRAMS

- All Title I public schools in Brevard are school-wide programs, meaning Title I funds, along with other local, state, and federal funding sources are used to support <u>all</u> students in the school
- The primary focus of the Title I program is to support the students most at-risk for academic failure
- School identify specific groups of students that need more intensive academic support. These subgroups are show in the School Improvement Plan (SIP)


PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT REQUIREMENTS

- Show evidence of <u>continuous communication</u> between school and families




