

 - Have families who are more actively engaged in their learning (Howard, 2010)












Pre-K to K Transition Forms

School Security

Remember—safety for all students is our priority!

- All visitors/volunteers must sign-in at the front office using your state issued driver's license or ID card. This is required in order to receive a badge to enter campus. You must have your ID at each visit.






Typical Day in Kindergarten M-TH - 8:00 AM - 2:30 PM F - 8:00 AM-1:15 PM

- 7:30 School Opens
- 7:30-7:50 Common area for students to gather before classroom doors open. Free Breakfast is served.
- 7:50 Classroom Doors Open. Unpack.
- 7:50-8:00 Morning Work/ Attendance. Be on time.
- 8:00-9:30 Reading Block (90 minutes) Integrated Science and Social Studies
- **9:30-10:00** Recess (30 a day)

- 10:35-11:05 Lunch (30 minutes and students will go by class)

How to Prepare your child for Kindergarten

- Let's face it: Kindergarten isn't what it used to be. (Expectations and Rigor)
- Help prepare your child in a variety of developmental areas to make the transition into kindergarten as smooth as possible.
- Just 15-20 minutes of playing and learning with your child can make a world of difference!

- Social/Emotional Development: Encourage your child to persist in tasks when encountering a problem. When your child cannot find a solution on his own, encourage him to calmly ask for help.
- Language Development: Verbally give your child specific one-step and two-step directions and encourage him to follow through.
- Cognitive Development: Have your child help you sort items according to color, size, and shape
- Physical Development (Gross & Fine Motor): Give your child plenty of opportunities for outdoor play: running, jumping, and climbing









Personal Skills

- •The **BEST** thing you can do for us this summer is make sure your child is independent in:
 - Toileting skills
 - Zipping, buttoning own apparel, etc.
 - Tying shoes (or have them wear Velcro)
 - Able to use scissors (have them practice)
