Tardy Students

Students arriving after 8:00 am must be escorted into the front office and checked in by an adult. For safety reasons, no student should be dropped off when there are no adults in the car loop. Thank you!



Thank you for your patience and cooperation during our inclement weather dismissals recently. As a reminder, the procedures for weather dismissals are:

- If there is light rain and no lightning, we will have a REGULAR DISMISSAL
- If there is heavy rain, even if there is no lightning, we will conduct a RAINY-DAY DISMISSAL (walkers/bikers are held indoors, car loop dismissal continues)
- If there is lightning in the vicinity, we will conduct a LIGHTNING
 DISMISSAL (all students are held indoors until it is safe to dismiss)

All Brevard Public Schools follow emergency procedures and guidelines in the event of severe weather. Brevard County is in a geographic area with a high risk of lightning strikes and lightning-related incidents/injuries. Understanding that the weather changes very quickly, lightning dismissal is often not called until the last minute. In these times of severe weather, dismissal may be suspended until it is safe to release students. When technology systems are working properly, an email/text message is sent through FOCUS. Your patience is appreciated during the wait time before your child can be released. We will always err on the side of safety and students will be dismissed if/when conditions improve.

Once again, we thank you for your cooperation as we work together to keep our students and staff safe!





When a student misses days a month
