# Purple Star Designation

On Tuesday, November 15, 2022, Holland Elementary was recognized by Governor DeSantis and the Florida Department of Education as a Purple Star School of Distinction! The Purple Star School of Distinction Designation, established by the Florida Legislature (House Bill 429) and signed into law in June 2021, recognizes schools that support the unique needs of military families.

A Purple Star School of Distinction supports military families through the implementation of activities such as:

- Highlighting annual military recognition events, e.g., Month of the Military Child, Month of the Military Family, Purple-Up! for Military Kids, Veterans Day and Memorial Day;
- Publicizing support for military students and families;
- Providing opportunities for active-duty parents to volunteer at the school;
- Participating in one or more service projects that connect the school with the military community; and
- Offering the Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (JROTC) program.

We will maintain our designation as a Purple Star School of Distinction for three school years.

We are thrilled to introduce our COMPASS Student-Led Military Transition Team! COMPASS stands for Children of Military Parents *Adapt, Succeed, & Shine!* These students, from military families themselves, will lead our school in supporting military students as they transition to Holland. The team includes a Transition Team Coordinator and is a peer-support system linking new military students with others at our school within two weeks of their arrival, helping familiarize our new students with our campus, routines, school procedures, and upcoming events.


