

BPS School Board Approves Hurricane lan Make-Up Days

At Tuesday night's School Board meeting, the Board approved the Superintendent's recommendation for Hurricane Ian make-up days. The approved plan moves two days from second semester to first semester. Those days are January 6th and January 9th. The second semester will now begin on January 10, 2023. In addition, the board approved converting four early release Fridays to regular school days. The days impacted are:

- November 4, 2022
- November 18, 2022
- December 2, 2022
- January 6, 2023

Stay tuned for make-up information for Hurricane Nicole that will occur in 2023.

Early Literacy Corner

Parents Can Help Nurture Healthy Language Development

Children are wordsmiths! They love to tell stories. They often come home with a new joke to tell. They are quick to learn and use new vocabulary. "Read it again" is a phrase that often comes from a child's lips.

Provide opportunities for your child to practice new skills during these important early childhood years.

Talk while doing everyday things. Point out familiar places or objects. Describe and talk about items you see. Speak clearly. Pause for younger children, so they may imitate and understand you.

Read books, sing, and say rhymes with your child every day. As your children mature, have them predict what will happen in the story. Invite them to act it out or draw a picture. Ask "Who," "What," When," "Where" and "Why" questions during the story or in conversation.

Provide your child with writing materials and the time and space to use them.


Go to museums, visit libraries and enjoy hobbies that broaden your children's knowledge of the world beyond their home and neighborhood.
