IMPORTANT COLLEGE/CAREER INFORMATION

If you are going to college or trade school, there is financial aid available if you fill out the FASFA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

In preparation, please make sure that both the student AND the parent create your FSA IDs BEFOREHAND, since it takes 1-3 days for the account to be activated before you can start the FASFA

You can create those accounts at https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch.

EFSC will be here January 23 to help you fill out your EFSC application, as well as **FAFSA** (even if you're not going to EFSC). Parents, this is a great opportunity to have **financial aid experts** help you fill out FAFSA – **bring your SSN and 2022 tax returns**.



SAT Test Dates for 2023-2024

U.S. deadlines apply to students testing in the United States and U.S. territories.

U.S. registration materials that are mailed must be postmarked by the U.S. deadlines. The deadlines expire at 11:59 p.m. Eastern Time, U.S. Additional fees apply if you register late, change your test center, change your test date, or switch from taking the SAT to taking a Subject Test after registering. Find out how to make registration changes and get deadlines. Your registration options will be limited if you aren't <u>taking the SAT for one of its main purposes</u>.
