## What is the Cambridge Checkpoint Program?

- ☐ Cambridge Lower Secondary Checkpoint offers curricula for LA, Math, and Science.
- The purpose: prepare students for the demands and expectations of specialized, advanced academic programs in high school.
- It provides students with the opportunity to excel beyond Florida Sunshine State Standards.
- The curriculum focuses on preparing students for the culminating tests specifically required for the Cambridge certificate.
- ☑ Content is delivered through traditional academic and project-based learning units that enrich students' knowledge while allowing them to master academic content.

## So what makes the Cambridge Program unique?

- ✓ Look at the "Big Picture" --the future...
- Students earning a Cambridge Diploma and completing 100 hours community service qualify for the highest amount of Florida Bright Futures Scholarship money awarded, regardless of SAT/ACT scores.
- Students passing Cambridge exams are guaranteed college credit in all Florida public universities.
- Whichever high school your child attends, he/she will be better prepared for having gone through this program!

## Who is eligible to participate in the Checkpoint Program?

- All students are welcome to apply, but there are some requirements...
- ☐ This program is for the academically motivated student!
- Students must have a 3.0 or higher GPA (grade point average) for this current school year <u>and</u> the previous school year
- Students must have scored a level 3 or higher in Reading & Math on the FSA (Florida Standards Assessment) **OR** an equivalent standardized test/achievement test score

## How do I apply to the Checkpoint Program?

- Applications must be completed by midnight *February 24, 2023.*

## Frequently asked questions...

How many out of area (non-KMS zoned) students will be accepted into the Checkpoint Program?

<u>Answer</u>: Kennedy may accept as many students earn a seat into the program—it matters not that they are out of area students.

☑ How many students will be accepted into the Checkpoint Program?

Answer: We will select 66 7<sup>th</sup> grade students and 66 8<sup>th</sup> grade students.

**☑** Does my child have to go to Rockledge High School if they are in the Cambridge Program at Kennedy?

<u>Answer</u>: No, Cambridge Lower Secondary Program helps prepares students for success at the next level and beyond whether it be with Cambridge IGCSE and AICE, AP or IB. However, if he/she plans to continue in the Cambridge Program, Rockledge High School is the only central area high school offering it.

☑ Are there any skill gaps that a student in the program acquires?

<u>Answer</u>: NO, Cambridge has specifically mapped out their standards side by side with the Florida Standards & Common Core Standards. All students will be taught BOTH standards/objectives simultaneously.

☑ Will there be a fee to apply/attend this Choice Program?

Answer: Yes, for students NOT zoned for Kennedy Middle School.

**☑** Will regional bussing be provided for out of area students?

<u>Answer:</u> No, unfortunately, that was discontinue for all Choice programs and Educational Learning Option schools.
