# Who Qualifies For AVID? Students who:

- Have both the potential and desire to attend a 4-year college or university
- Display appropriate classroom behavior
- Have a 2.0 GPA or higher
- Have a good attendance record
- Demonstrate excellent work ethic and good behavior
- Are from families historically under served in colleges and universities
- Would like to get support in their present courses and take advanced courses with tutoring in middle school
- Complete an application and interview process
- Will commit to at least one high school credit course in middle school.
- Have FSA scores in mid-range (high level 2 to low level 4)
