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Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) is a progress monitoring system that is administered three times per year to track your student's progress in learning the Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards throughout this school year. The purpose of this letter is to inform you that your student will participate in the third administration (PM3) of the Grade 3-6 Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics Assessments on May 2 (ELA) and May 3 (Math). The results from PM3 will show how well your student has mastered the grade level content standards, and you will be provided with information about how to access the results after testing is completed.

Your student's FAST assessments are computer-adaptive tests taken on a computer or tablet. The questions get less or more difficult depending on how a student responds, and each student will see different questions from a common item bank. Each test attempt (PM1, PM2, and PM3) will present items that cover the entire test "blueprint," meaning students will encounter items representative of the standards within the subject or grade level. Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) is a progress monitoring system that is administered three times per year to track your student's progress in learning the Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards throughout this school year. The purpose of this letter is to inform you that your student will take the Kindergarten/Grade 1/Grade 2 Renaissance **Star Early Literacy, Star Reading, and/or Star Math assessment(s)** on May 9th (ELA) and May 10th (Math). The results from PM3 will show how well your student has mastered the grade level content standards, and you will be provided with information about how to access the results after testing is completed.

Your student's FAST assessments are computer-adaptive tests taken on a computer or tablet. The questions get less or more difficult depending on how a student responds, and each student will see different questions. If you or your student would like to review **Star Early Literacy. Star Reading. and/or Star Math** sample items at home, sample test items are available at https://flfast.org/resources/renaissance-star/renaissance-star/

The Star Early Literacy assessment typically takes less than 15 minutes to complete. The Star Reading assessment is usually completed in less than 20 minutes, and the Star Math assessment typically takes less than 30 minutes to complete.

- Electronic Devices—Students are not permitted to have any electronic devices, including, but not limited to, cell phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing or during breaks (e.g., restroom), even if the devices are turned off or students do not use them. If your student is found with an electronic device or is found using Bluetooth/wireless headphones/earbuds during testing, his or her test will be invalidated.
- Calculator Policy—For Grade 6 only FAST Mathematics, a four-function calculator embedded within the assessment may be used.
- Testing Rules Acknowledgment—All tests include a Testing Rules Acknowledgment that reads: "I
 understand the testing rules that were just read to me. If I do not follow these rules, my test score may
 be invalidated." Prior to testing, test administrators read the rules to students, and students
 acknowledge that they understand the testing rules by clicking the box in the secure browser indicating
 they understand the testing rules.
- Discussing Test Content after Testing—The last portion of the testing rules read to students before they click the box to accept the Testing Rules Acknowledgment states that because the content of all statewide assessments is secure, students may not discuss or reveal details about the test content (including test items and passages) after the test. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, or posting to social media sites. Please make sure your student understands this policy prior to testing and remind them that "discussing" test content includes any kind of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, posting to social media, or sharing online. While students may not share information about secure test content after testing, this policy is not intended to prevent students from discussing their testing experiences with their parents/families.
- Working Independently—Students are responsible for doing their own work during the test and for
 protecting their answers from being seen by others. If students are caught cheating during testing, their
 tests will be invalidated.
- Leaving Campus—If your student leaves campus before completing a test (e.g., for lunch, an appointment), he or she will not be allowed to return to that test. If your student does not feel well on the day of testing, it may be best for him or her to wait and be tested on a make-up day. Please remember not to schedule appointments on testing days.
- Testing Accommodations—If your student has an Individual Education Plan (IEP), a Section 504 Plan, or is an English Language Learner (ELL) or a recently exited ELL, testing accommodations will be provided for your student.





VOLUNTEER INFORMATION

All approved BPS volunteers attend a volunteer orientation prior to volunteering at Longleaf to see what opportunities for involvement are available, meet other volunteers, and learn our policies. This includes volunteering to assist teachers with parties, events, and field trips.

Once you complete the online application proceed to the district office for fingerprinting. It can take up to 90 days to be approved. The volunteer status must be updated annually.

Lunch Bunch is a new initiative this year to provide families an opportunity to have lunch in school. This program is available on Thursdays and supervised by our approved BPS volunteers or school designees. The families of our Bobcats are asked to sign up to attend lunch on a monthly basis to provide opportunities to all our families. The following procedures are followed to maintain safety on campus.

1. Come at your student's designated time. We will not call students out of class early.

2. Sign-in at the front office with proper ID and get a badge.

3. Visitors will be escorted to our designated "Bobcat Lunch Bunch" area located in the Commons.

4. Students will be brought to/from the lunch area by our volunteer staff.

5. Visitors will check-out in the front office when their student is picked-up by the teacher. If you have multiple students, you will need to check-out and check back in at their designated time as we do not have a waiting area.

Safety Reminders:

Parents/guests may not enter the cafeteria or go through the lunch line. Contacts on the student registration form are allowed to eat with the students. The contact may bring an additional guest with them. Other classmates will not be allowed to join your student for lunch. Outside food will remain with the parents as well as any leftovers. Parents also have the option of checking their student out and taking them off campus for lunch.
