




Florida Assessment for Student Thinking (FAST)

Testing Dates for the first FAST progress monitoring session

September 6th & 7th: 3rd through 6th grade September 12th & 13th: 1st and 2nd grade September 12th through 29th: Kindergarten



We ask that you please not schedule appointments on your child's testing dates.

The Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) is a progress monitoring tool that will be administered 3 times per year to track your students' progress in learning the Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards throughout the year. Your student's results from these tools are for informational purposes only. You will be given information about how to access the results after the testing is completed.

FAST assessments are computer-adaptive tests taken on a computer or tablet. The questions get easier or more difficult depending on how the student responds and each student will see different questions.

BELL SCHEDULE:

The McAuliffe bell schedule is as follows:

Arrival: 7:30AM Students can NOT be dropped off before 7:30AM

Breakfast: 7:30AM—7:55AM, breakfast is FREE for ALL students at McAuliffe.

Classrooms Open: 7:45AM Pre-Start Bell: 7:55AM

Instruction Begins: 8:00AM Children arriving after 8:00AM are marked tardy.

Dismissal Begins at 2:30PM All students are dismissed.

REMINDER:

<u>Students are NOT allowed on campus before 7:30AM</u>, staff is not on duty until then. Students need to be picked up no later than 2:45PM. on regular days and 1:30 on early release days. Children who are picked up late will be sent to the Brevard After School Program. A \$29.00 drop-in fee and a \$25.00 registration fee will be charged if they are sent to child care.

Drop off and Pick up Procedures: When dropping students off only do so at the overhang and only along the sidewalk, not in the 2nd lane of the car loop. For pick-up, remain in your vehicle until your child is delivered to your car at dismissal. Only use **the car loop and not the bus loop** for drop-off and pick-up. **DO NOT** park on the sidewalks because students must then walk in the streets. Police will issue tickets for parking on the sidewalks and in no parking zones.

The bus loop and the back parking areas of the school are **NOT** meant for student drop-off or pick-up, only use the car loop for drop-off. These procedures are in place for the safety of our students.

STUDENTS ARE RELEASED AT 1:15PM EVERY FRIDAY

TARDY POLICY- Students arriving after 8:00AM will need to be walked into the office by an adult, this is for the safety of the students. We appreciate your cooperation.

EARLY CHECK-OUT PROCEDURES

When students are checked out early for any reason during a time they are not in their classroom (P.E., Music, Art, Media, recess, lunch, etc.), they <u>WILL NOT</u> be able to retrieve their belongings from the classroom as they are locked. Their items will remain locked up in their classroom until they return to school. If you know ahead of time that you will be checking your child
out early, send a note to the teacher so they have your student keep their belongings with them.

Please note: Early Check-out ends at 2:00PM on regular days & 12:45PM on early release days, please plan accordingly.

DON'T FORGET TO BRING A VALID, STATE ISSUED, PHOTO ID AS IT IS REQUIRED TO SIGN A STUDENT OUT.



EMERGENCY CHANGE OF CLOTHING

If your child is in Pre-K, Kindergarten or 1st grade, or has any reason they may need a clean set of clothes while at school, it is extremely important for you to pack a spare set (top, bottoms and under garments) in a Ziploc bag, labeled with their first and last name and put it in their backpack. Check your child's backpacks frequently for soiled clothing and don't forget to replace it with a clean set. We have <u>very limited</u> spare clothing in the clinic. If your child has an accident or other issue that requires a change of clothes, and does not have any with them, you will have to bring some to them. *THANK YOU!*

SAC is a committee of McAuliffe stakeholders which include parents who have been approved by other McAuliffe parents to help our administration, teachers, and staff to develop and evaluate the School Improvement Plan (SIP). Title I Information

Title I is a federally funded program designed to improve achievement at schools with a high percentage of students eligible for free and reduced lunch prices. Every student enrolled in our school is eligible for Title I services. Programs are designed to serve children who need extra help in meeting state standards. Our school has coordinated our Title I plan with our School Improvement Plan (SIP). Parents who are elected to serve on the School Advisory Committee (SAC) participate in the development and review of all school plans including the Parent-Student-Teacher Compact, and Parent Involvement Plan. Copies of these plans are available on our website, upon request from the front office, and can be viewed in our Parent Involvement Binder located in the front lobby. State Education Agency (SEA) Complaint Procedures: If any Local Education Agency or School Plans (e.g. Title I LEA Plan, Title LEA PIP, Title I School PFEP or SIP) are not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, the school district will submit any parent comments with the Title I, Part A plan when the school district submits the plan to the State Department of Education. Parents must be informed of their rights to submit comments. Comments received at Title I schools MUST be forwarded to the Office of Title I and those comments will be included with the submission of the LEA Title I plan, as required.

ESSA/NCLB: PARENTS' RIGHT TO KNOW

Let the Butterfly Struggle



There's a story about a mother who discovered a butterfly struggling to escape its cocoon through a tiny opening at the top. She became concerned when the creature seemed to give up after making no progress; certain that the butterfly wouldn't make it out without help, she enlarged the hole.

On its next try, the butterfly wriggled out easily. But the young woman's joy turned to horror when she saw its wings were shriveled and useless. Her well-intentioned intervention had interrupted a natural process. Forcing the butterfly to squeeze though a small opening is nature's way of assuring that blood from the creature's body is pushed into the wings, by making it easier, she deprived the butterfly of strong wings.

Childhood, too, is a sort of cocoon. If a healthy adult is to emerge, parents must allow, even encourage, their children to struggle, make mistakes, learn from them and pay the price for bad judgments and conduct.

Of course, good parents should protect their children from serious harm, but being overprotective can itself inflict damage. Adversity is not always an enemy. Teaching can help a young person develop wings strengthened by self-confidence and self-reliance.

Helen Keller once said, "Character cannot be developed in ease and quiet. Only through experience of trial and suffering can the soul be strengthened, vision cleared, ambition inspired and success achieved."

- Always check with a teacher before showing up to a classroom. Volunteering must be scheduled ahead of
 time as tests, meetings, and other events may be scheduled.
