2. All required subject-area credits completed except 1 credit each in English, Math, Science, and Social Studies.
3. Meet the minimum “college-ready” score in Reading, Writing, and Mathematics. Scores must be from test(s) taken no more than 2 years prior to starting classes. SAT/ACT scores must be on file at EFSC.
