## STUDENTS WHO DON'T FEEL WELL...

- Students exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms will be sent home for 10 days. Students may return before the 10 days are up IF they have a doctor's note clearing them to return to school

OR have a negative COVID-19 test (cannot be a rapid antigen test).

- Students with COVID-19 symptoms should be picked up from school ASAP. They will not be sent home on a bus.
- Students are able to get a first responder COVID-19 test by calling the FLDOH @ (321) 454-7141 and scheduling an appointment IF they are symptomatic. There is no fee for this test.
- Please keep your student home if they are not feeling well. We ask that you email the teacher to let them know why your child is out of school. All absences are excused with a parent note or doctor's note.

We understand this is an inconvenience to your family but our #1 priority is to keep our building safe and healthy.

## FOR ELEARNING PARENTS.....

Thank you to those parents that brought your student in for testing this past week. We appreciate your support and flexibility!

Please remember that eLearning is a commitment. In order for it to be successful for your student, please remember the following:

- Students must be logged in on time each day from 8am-2:30pm. Students are marked absent or checked out early if they are not responding to the teacher.
